



Director's Note


Dial "M" for Murder has been around since the late 1940's. Considering its history, it's hard to believe that author Frederick Knott failed at numerous attempts to get the play produced. Finally the BBC picked up the script for television (to rave reviews). Producers immediately sat up and took notice. Within months the play had become a wildly popular London stage production, quickly moving to Broadway. Since then there have been countless productions, radio plays, and two movies (one filmed in 3D by an obscure director named Alfred Hitchcock).

I am not much of a puzzle person, the "Whodunit" genre is not much my cuppa. I much prefer the "Why did they do it?" and the "Are they going to get away with it?" tropes. Seeing the dastardly deed planned and watching it play out for good or ill, and following the hero's journey to discover the key, is to me much more fun.

As it 'tis the season for frightening, and for dark and stormy nights for older tales, as they are often the best; we present to you a tale that has been oft told, one which indeed includes a dark and stormy night, where a murder has been bought and paid for.






