One of the most popular and tuneless of all Strauss operettas, "Die Fledermaus," will be presented to Tacoma by the Little Theatre June 18, 19, 20, 21, and 25, 26, 27, 28, in a brilliant production with a local cast, directed by one of America's foremost operatic coaches.

"Die Fledermaus," under Mr. Gebert's direction, was one of the most successful productions ever staged by the Seattle Lyric Opera. The plot abounds with hilariously funny situations, the settings are colorful, and the music by Johann Strauss (much of it borrowed by Hollywood for "The Great Waltz") is enchanting.

The Drama League is indeed fortunate to have secured the services of such an outstanding director as Mr. Gebert, internationally noted as former conductor of the Berlin State Opera, the Prague Opera, the Berlin Philharmonic and Symphony Orchestra.
