### "OUR TOWN"

Author: Thornton Wilder

Director: Jerry Van Steenbergen

#### STORY OF THE PLAY

In the first act the author genially outlines the history of the town, which is Grover's Corners, N. H., and something of the character of its citizens. Then he carries you into the house of the Gibbs and Webb families, substantial homes containing substantial folks. You arrive at breakfast time and are carried through one entire day in the lives of these good people.

The second act concerns the love affair between young George Gibbs and little Emily Webb, and thus culminates in a moving wedding scene, which contains all those elements of poignant sorrow and abundant happiness that make for solemnity and impressiveness.

In the third act we are led to the cemetery on the hill, where many of the townspeople we have come to know so well are patiently and smilingly awaiting not "judgment" but greater understanding. Into their midst is led the bride, a little timid at first, a little wistful to go back to life, to live again with her memories. But she is shown how impossible, how futile it is to return. The past cannot be re-lived. Living people, humans, occupied with their petty occupations and small thoughts, know little of true joy of happiness. Truth is to be found only in the future.

### WHO'S WHO IN "OUR TOWN"

- RENO ODLIN (The Stage Mgr.) A native son; Sedro Woolley was the place. Graduate of University of Washington, Princeton University and Toulouse University, France. President of Puget Sound National Bank of Tacoma. (That's advertising for which he will be billed at regular program rates). An amateur astronomer; has a deep interest in the drama, and a member of the Board of Governors of T.L.T. Naturally modest and of a retiring nature, in spite of which he has a fitting story for any and all occasions. His first appearance on our stage-we hope it will not be the last.
- PRESTON ONSTAD (Dr. Gibbs) Photography his hobby. A veteran of T.L.T., appearing in "Icebound", "Excursion" and "Knickerbocker Holiday". Then the Army got him. Saw service in the islands and elsewhere. First appearance after his release was as Dr. Hochberg in "Men in White".
- BILL BOYLE (Jim Crowell) Took part in senior class plays at Stadium Hi. Worked back stage in a meller-drammer, "Love Rides The Rails". The lure of the foot-lights and the smell of grease paint got himwhat it does with him remains to be seen. His first appearance before a T.L.T. audience.
- ED LEWIS (Howie Newsome) The success of every T.L.T. production is dependent to a large extent upon Ed's work back-stage. He is and has for several years been at the head of the electrical department. If our historical data is correct, this is his third appearance on our stage; "Christmas Carol" 1935-6 season in our Old Town theater; "Kismet" in our present quarters in 1942 and now, "Our Town".
- HELEN CHAPMAN (Mrs. Gibbs) To record all of Helen's accomplishments would require several pages. Briefly she is a member of the current Board of Directors of T.L.T. and takes a great deal of interest in other organizations of a similar nature. To T.L.T. patrons she is probably best remembered for her outstanding performance as "Susan", the titular role in "Susan and God", season of 1939-40.
- TRUDY REDMAYNE (Mrs. Webb) Graduate from the school of dramatics, U of W: did radio work in Tacoma and Seattle. First appearance on T.L.T. stage as "Mrs. Stanton" in "It's A Wise Child"; as "Dora" in "Dear Ruth". A natural born trouper and a grand person.
- JIMMY WINN (Wally Webb) Up from the ranks of the CHILDREN'S THEATER. Made his first appearance and did a nice job as "Daniel" in "Family Portrait". Experience is what the youngsters need and that is what the LITTLE THEATER endeavors to give them.
- MARY LEE ODLIN (Emily Webb) Undoubtedly the best known youngster in our organization. She's ambitious and nothing daunts her. If she's not working in a show you'll find her back-stage making herself useful. Has appeared in Children's Theater productions, taken juvenile leads in "Dear Ruth", "Nothing But The Truth", "Only An Orphan Girl", "Philadelphia Story", and now 'Emily', Understudied "Fluffy Adams" in "Junior Miss".
- SHERMAN DAY (Prof. Willard) Made his debut as "Dr. McCabe" in "Men in White". Must have liked it because he came back for more.
- DR. MAL MacDONALD (Mr. Webb) Scenic Decorating Chairman and member of the Board of Directors, season 1946-7. First appearance on our stage as "Joseph" in "Family Portrait", followed by "Gene Tuttle" in "Personal Appearance". Graduate of the Philadelphia College of Optometry and a member of the "Caswell Optical Co." 9th & St. Helens. (More advertising; think we'll have to bill him for it.)
- CARRIE SIMONS (Woman in Audience) Needs no introduction to T.L.T. audiences.
