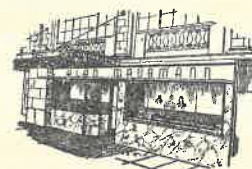

## TONIGHT'S PLAY and the AUTHOR

"I REMEMBER MAMA" has been a good deal of a family affair from the first. Kathryn Forbe's volume of short stories, "MAMA'S BANK ACCOUNT" was first read by Mary Rogers, who is Richard Rogers' oldest daughter. Mary encouraged her mother to read it, and she was as enthusiastic as her daughter. Mrs. Rodgers in turn called it to the attention of Mrs. Oscar Hammerstein, who in turn insisted her husband should read it. Whereupon everyone in the two families decided something must be done about "MAMA'S BANK ACCOUNT". John van Druten was approached and he agreed to make the adaption, and so the play was written. It had its opening at the Music Box in New York on October 10, 1944.

The producers, Rogers and Hammerstein, discovered they had the perfect play for

the escapist, as here was a story with no touch of war or the results of war. It has a persuasiveness that charms even the most sophisticated. There is an appeal, as Mr. van Druten says, "not due to its staging but rather to a basic reality and humanity in Miss Kathryn Forbes' characters, whom it was my pleasure and privilege to present on the stage."

For those of us who live on the West Coast the play has an added interest in that the setting is laid in San Francisco. "For as long as I could remember, the house on Steiner Street had become home. Papa and Mama had both been born in Norway, but they came to San Francisco because Mama's sisters were here". And so Katrin begins to tell the story of her childhood. It is a simple, endearing account of her family's everyday life, which, like most commonplace lives, is filled with both humor and real pathos. The Tacoma Little Theater offers this play with the hope and belief, that even though you may have seen the legitimate or movie production, or both, you will again go away from "I REMEMBER MAMA" with a warmed heart.
