



THE PLAY and ITS AUTHORS

"BOY MEETS GIRL" was first produced by George Abbott at the Cort Theatre, New York City, Nov. 27, 1935. The production was also directed by George Abbott. Its authors, Bella and Samuel Spewack, (husband and wife) are playwrights by preference and movie writers by profession. In tonight's play the authors report what they have seen and observed, not what convention would want them to see. They have captured Hollywood so definitely that you cannot see this play without a great consciousness of the kind of place that it is. You don't see the long line of eucalyptus trees outside the windows, but you must know that it is there. You must know that down in the court below C.F.'s window there are a dozen strutting assistant directors and executives and innumerable glamorous girls posturing for the benefit of all.

If, however, authenticity were the only virtue of BOY MEETS GIRL, it would die unsung. It is the wit of the Spewacks that casts over the whole thing a gay charm. They know how to write lines which are not only funny to read but which crackle when spoken in the theatre, and are a new angle for saying "boy meets girl; boy loves girl; boy wins girl".


