"BEGGAR ON HORSEBACK"

There are 21 male and female characters in the cast. Tryouts for casting will be held at the theatre Monday, February 20, 8:00 p.m.—YOU (whether or not a member of TLT) are cordially invited to read for one of the parts. If you're not interested in acting, come to the tryouts and leave your name so that you may be called to work on one of the backstage committees.

From the standpoint of interesting and exciting theatre, "Beggar on Horseback" has "everything". The play is the story of a young composer's nightmare after he has considered marriage to a business man's daughter of wealth instead of to the simple-living, stable girl "across the hall" in his apartment building.

The play is well described as an eposotic, expressionistic fantasy—and, full of fun. From a production standpoint, "Beggar" will be a stimulating experience for those behind the scenes as well as for the actors. There will be some 25 scene changes.

In the major roles are one composer, Neil McRae, 25 years of age, serious, sensitive; Cynthia Mason, 25 years, wholesome, pretty, stable; Mr. and Mrs. Cady; their constant "vitamin-taking" son, Homer; their social debutante daughter, Gladys; Dr. Albert Rice, 35 years; a host of butlers, maids, Miss Hey, Miss You, waiters, reporters, jurors, sightseers, novelist, poets and artists.

Because of its production problems, this play is seldom produced in community theatres. It presents a challenge to us in all departments—lighting, set construction, design, costume, make-up, music, etc.

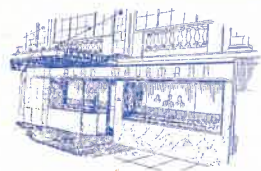

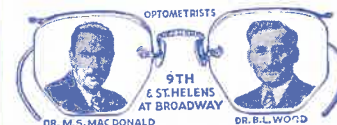

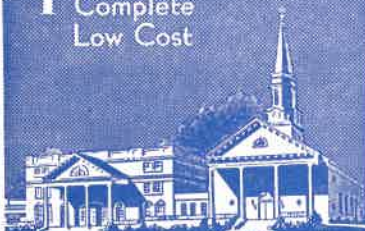
