Welcome to Tacoma Little Theatre!



Suzy has previously directed Shakespeare's *Macheth, Romeo and Juliet, Twelfth Night,* and *Comedy of Errors.* Other favorite shows (at Lakewood Playhouse, Stadium High School, and other theatres) include *Fahrenheit 451, To Kill a Mockingbird, Once on this Island, Secret in the Wings, Working, Waiting for Godot,* and *Nina Variations.* Since 2000, her company, Found Space Productions, has staged more than twenty productions, many on-site.
