

Director's Note

Steve Martin is arguably one of the best known and most talented comedians in America. In 1993 Martin decided to write his first play, *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*, thus adding playwright to his long list of titles, including stand-up comedian, actor, screenwriter, author, producer, and musician,. The play achieved instant success, receiving rave reviews after premiering in both New York City and Los Angeles in 1995.

Like the main characters of *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*, Martin had to overcome many obstacles to achieve his dreams. He had to push the boundaries limiting him and re-think ideas with new perspectives. Martin writes with a clear fascination for the power of creativity and how we define the products of creativity. Are both artists and scientists creative but just in different ways? Martin's positive message to the audience: great creative potential exists in humanity.

Martin's fascination with Picasso began long before 1993. As he writes on his personal website: "I went to the Metropolitan and there's Picasso's painting of the Lapin Agile [The Nimble Rabbit]. I thought of that picture's journey from that little bar [in Paris] to the Met some 40 million dollars later". As he wrote the play, the idea to create the character of Einstein suddenly occurred to him; Martin had not originally planned for the famous scientist to be in the script. Martin researched Einstein's background and decided that it made perfect sense for him to exist in the world of the play.

By Martin choosing to include Picasso and Einstein in *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*, he amplifies the connection between the two historical men and the significance of their innovations. What makes their association even more interesting is that Picasso and Einstein both presented their new ideas and works within a few years of each other; in 1905 Einstein published his revolutionary Theory of Relativity papers and in 1907 Picasso painted his first Cubistic work, Les Demoiselles d'Avignon. These inventions ushered in the twentieth century, along with the ideas and standards of modern art and science.

Though famous later in their lives, in the play both of these men are on the cusps of their brilliant careers. It's 1904. They are still undiscovered, which shows in the place that they choose to spend their time: an unimportant bar for artists and free-thinkers called Lapin Agile.

We have thoroughly enjoyed our time in our Lapin Agile: the creative process of bringing these eccentric characters to life has been filled with lots of laughter but also with many moments of thoughtful consideration of what art really is. Thank you for joining us at the Lapin Agile. Be prepared to rethink your ideas about the power of creativity and celebrate, with us, your own great creative potential.

Paul Sobrie (Sagot)


