
DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Winner of the 1980 Tony Award, *Children of a Lesser God*, continues to be illuminating and timely. The New York Post wrote, "In any season this play would be a major event, a play of great importance, absorbing and interesting, full of love, understanding and passion."

This play presents a number of unique challenges. Medoff, the playwright, appropriately insists that the roles of Sarah, Orin and Lydia be performed by Deaf or hard of hearing actors to the best of the theatre's ability. Of the seven characters, six must be fluent in signing ASL. With extraordinary collaboration from folks we've met in the Deaf Community here in Tacoma, and from Deaf Spotlight (The Theatre of the Deaf) in Seattle, we were able to cast those roles as Medoff requested. As an indication of the power of this play and the support of the Deaf Community for its production, we received audition tapes from actors in New York, Texas and Portland, OR - actors passionate about this play because of its message of reconciliation between the hearing and Deaf Cultures, its potent artistry, and its determination to help its audiences more fully understand the differences that can, in the final essence, unite as well as divide. At the end of the play, the chasm between the worlds of sound and silence seems almost too great to cross . . . but love and compassion and a determination to try to understand "the other" hold the hope of reconciliation - certainly a message of great importance today.

It has been an indescribable honor to have worked with this stellar cast and crew and to have gotten to know and be advised by several members of the Deaf Community. Thank you for joining us in celebrating our Deaf and Hard of Hearing neighbors.

Rick Hornor (Director)

Rick retired a few years ago after having taught for 45 years. His teaching included junior and senior high schools in CA and NY then 28 years in the Theatre Department at Whitworth University in Spokane. He spends the month of August teaching and directing in the Youth Education program at Taproot Theatre in Seattle. Career highlights include directing at Daystar University in Nairobi, Kenya and directing *12 Angry Jurors* at LCC University in Klaipeda, Lithuania with actors from former Soviet bloc countries. 


What is American Sign Language?

American Sign Language (ASL) is a complete, complex language that employs signs made by moving the hands combined with facial expressions and postures of the body. It is the primary language of many North Americans who are deaf and is one of several communication options used by people who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing.

Is sign language the same in other countries?

No one form of sign language is universal. Different sign languages are used in different countries or regions. For example, British Sign Language (BSL) is a different language from ASL, and Americans who know ASL may not understand BSL.




