DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"Fair is foul, and foul is fair..."

As a director I have spent about 75% of my creative life exploring the dark corners of reality (albeit often in fantastical settings). I am a believer that most people are born good, and yet there is so much evil in the world. The how's and the why's of that is the puzzle that I keep returning to.

To dismiss Macbeth and his Lady as simply evil is, I believe selling them (and us) short.

My premise for this production is that the Great War (WWI) raged across Europe for a hundred years, leaving in its wake financial, political, and personal devastation for all. It is not a difficult conceit; there are many places in the world that have been torn apart by war for generations. What effect does that have on ones psyche? What is it to be living in a world where generations of people are all suffering from PTSD in one form or another?

That is this Scotland. Macbeth's world is a place that has reverted to superstition and feudalism, a world where industry died years ago, a place where you can't keep your powder dry and swords never run out of ammo.

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
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FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

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
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
