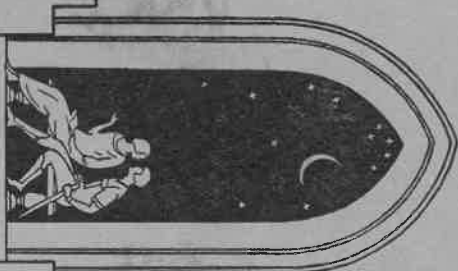

The action of the play takes place about the Italian town of Rimini in the 18th century.

SCENE I.—The great hall in the Malatesta Castle at Rimini.  
Intermission, two minutes.

SCENE II.—The same; morning, a week later.  
Intermission, five minutes.

SCENE III.—Outside an inn near Rimini; sunset.  
Intermission, three minutes.

SCENE IV.—The shop of Pulci; late evening.  
Intermission, three minutes.

SCENE V.—Outside the castle walls; near dawn.  
Intermission, three minutes.

SCENE VI.—Within the castle garden; dawn breaking.  
Intermission, three minutes.

SCENE VII.—Again the great hall; late evening of the second day after Giovanni's departure.
