## WHO'S WHO

**Salem A. Nourse** (*Sam Dodsworth*) Head of the Building Trusteeship, and a member of the New Building Program Committee, now engaged in planning a building addition to combine penthouse theatre, Green Room, and rehearsal hall. Also active in promoting Little Theatre Patrons organization for tax-deductible gifts to the theatre. Salem's name is quite a drawing card to those who have seen him in such plays as "The Heiress" and "Life with Father."

**Waldo Stone** (*Publicity Man*) Waldo is a graduate of the U. of W. law school and has maintained an office in Tacoma for the last 18 months. "Command Decision," "The Tavern," and "First Lady" all benefited by his performance. And he is that rare bird, an eligible bachelor—so, Annes, get your guns!

**Phoebe Crosby** (*Secretary*) This is Phoebe's first appearance on our stage, although she has played leading roles in several Theatre Guild productions, and won their award for the Best Supporting Role in "Little Foxes." Opening night there'll be a seat reserved for her husband, who is working toward his degree at C.P.S.

**Dr. Mal McDonald** (*Henry E. Hazzard*) It's nice having Mal back again after a four-year absence, during which he has been active in the Lake-wood Players. Last played here in "State of the Union" and "Boy Meets Girl," the best remembered for those wonderful villainous roles in the melodramas. If you're having trouble with this fine print, Mal is your man to see.

**Mary Ormsby** (*Fran Dodsworth*) Moo has been active in TLT in almost every capacity since 1941. Her initial role was in our first production of "The Women." More recently she has been seen in "Harvey," "The Tavern," and "Springtime for Henry." She has directed several major plays and this year is chairman of the Play Review Division.

**Norton Gordon** (*Tubby Pearson*) Students of archaeology will be interested in this find! Norty was stage manager around 1927-8-9 (A.D.) and played in "Sun Up," "Androcles and the Lion" and "Drama League Follies," of the same era. Now on staff of KTAC.

**Marieta Loren** (*Mrs. Pearson*) Although there are three young grandchildren and a newly-formed art class to occupy her leisure hours, Marieta's interest in the theatre brings her back to our stage for an occasional and always delightful performance. Last roles were in "Beggar on Horseback" and "I Remember Mama."

**Laura Shortt** (*Emily McKee*) A Whitman College drama major, new to TLT audiences. There's a fine 8-month-old boy at home, whose dad goes to CPS.

**Ted Knightlinger** (*Clyde Lockert*) "Your name sounds familiar," said we, "you live here?" Well, yes he does: Ted played in "Command Decision," "Harvey," "Petticoat Fever," "John Loves Mary;" manages radio station KTAC; and he's TLT's 1952-53 president.

She works for Weyerhaeuser as a varitypist, which couldn't be too strenuous because she has helped us the past two years backstage and also played the role of Miss Shackelford in "Goodbye My Fancy."

**Rosemary Lofquist (2nd American Lady)** Another "first" before the footlights, though she's been helping out backstage all year. Rosemary is a Stadium graduate and now has an interesting job at Hunt & Mottet. Those beautiful tweeds we've been seeing at rehearsals were acquired on a 5-month trip to England and France in the summer of 1951.

**George Smith (1st American Husband)** Since graduating last year from the U. of W., George has been teaching at Stewart, and his class in Dramatics is a popular one there. This is his first venture at TLT and we hope it is the fore-runner of many.

**Leonard Holden (2nd American Husband)** My, how he's grown! Do you remember the lad with the set of buck teeth (rubber) in "Chicken Every Sunday"? Now he teaches at Jason Lee, has two daughters, and in 1950-51 went to London as an exchange teacher.

**Donna Parmlee (2nd American Wife)** Donna came three years ago from Winnipeg, Canada, to live in Auburn, and took part in several productions of the Auburn Dramatic Club (now extinct). We feel immensely flattered to have

someone drive 34 miles a day to take part in one of our productions.

**Helen Chapman (Edith Cortright)** You couldn't meet a nicer "other woman." The Chapmans have two grown sons and spend their summers at their beach place at Rocky Bay. Helen's more recent roles in "Our Town," "Two Mrs. Carrolls," and "I Remember Mama" have given TLT audiences especial pleasure.

**Pete Schmitt (A Steward)** A Stadium senior who has done a lot of work backstage in the past three or four years, and took part in the rousing "Good News."

**Margaret Jones (Renee de Penable)** The Jones family keeps moving in and out of Tacoma, but they usually check in a TLT on their return, where there's a role waiting. Margaret was in the cast of "The Two Mrs. Carrolls," and appeared in "Seventeen" with sons Dick and Terry.

**Mark Hipkins (Arnold Israel)** Mark is a native Tacoman who has garnered theatrical experience in Seattle's Showboat and Penthouse Theatres and as an apprentice in the Cleveland Playhouse. At Puyallup High, his teaching subjects include a class in stagecraft. Did a nice bit in "Smilin' Through" last season.
