

The "Dinner at Eight" cast reads like an "All-Time-Great" of TLT, and hardly needs more than a recounting of names to forecast an evening of splendid and sparkling entertainment. Virtually all of the cast have turned in glowing performances in past shows, so you can settle back and be assured of a couple of hours of top-notch theatre. But here's a quick rundown, moreor-less in order of appearance.

Millicent Jordan (Helen Chapman). Always a top performer whom you've seen in "Our Town," "Two Mrs. Carrolls," "I Remember Mama," "Dodsworth," to name a few. Helen also co-directed the "Letter," and has long been active in anything for the good of TLT.

Oliver Jordan (Dr. Mal MacDonald) is a smooth performer and a great guy to work with in a show. You've seen Mal in "Dodsworth," "Detective Story," "The Letter" and several good play readings. Incidentally, Mal has his own offices now at 19th and Tacoma Ave. So., where he is an optometrist.

Here's another of the husband-and-wife teams:

Paula Jordan (Doris Busby), Mr. Hatfield (Francis Busby). Dr. Wayne Talbot (John Bryant). This is John's first return to TLT since last year's "Merry Widow," although he worked "Goodbye My Fancy" last fall at Lakewood, and very well, too. John and wife spent most of the time talking about 3-month-old John Jeffery, a mighty worth-while subject!

Bob Dettling doubles in this one as the **Bellboy** and the **Waiter.** Young Bob (He's still at Lincoln High) is creating quite a reputation as a character actor, which is fine for TLT. Surely you remember those parts in "Detective Story" and "Mr. Roberts!" Bob figures to continue his work at the U. of W. beyond graduation.

Max Kane (Bob Dixon). Behind that corncob pipe lays a sense of humor that gives a deft touch to roles such as this, the agent, Max Kane; and, believe me, you'll enjoy it as much as you did his characterizations in "Mr. Roberts" and "Detective Story."


