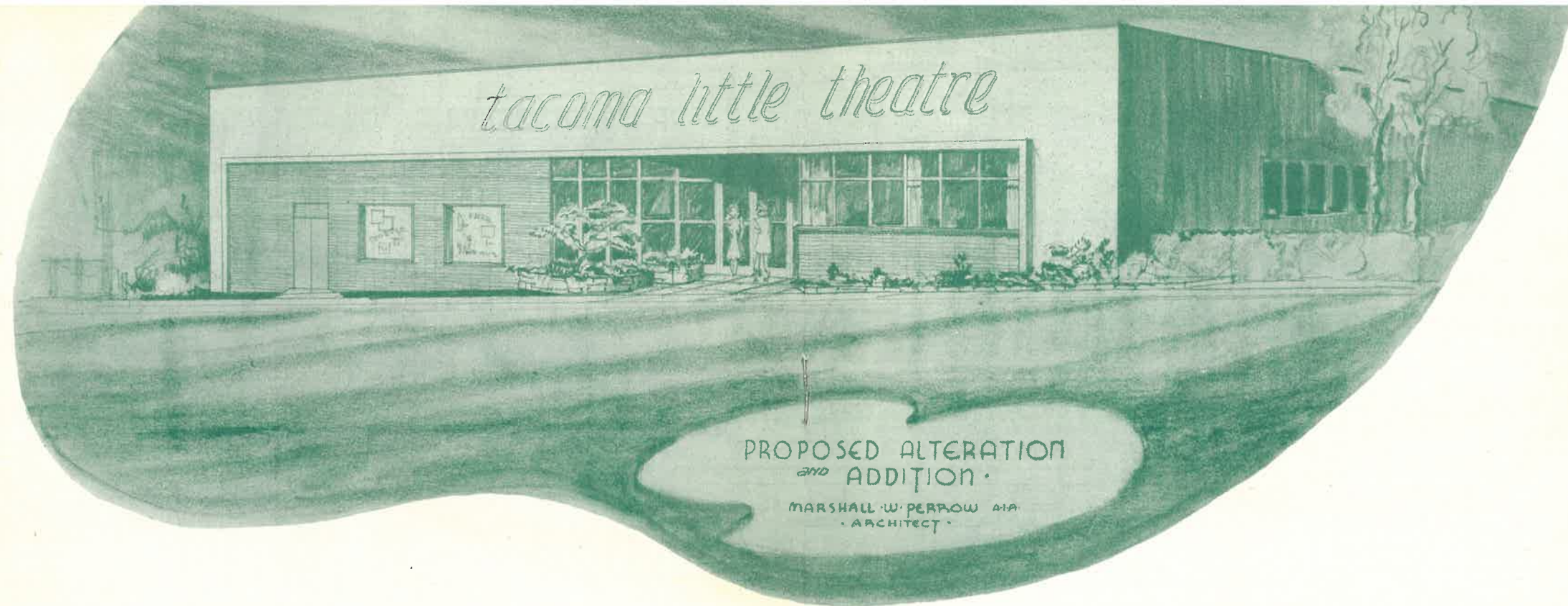

Elinor Bertram—Elinor, a newcomer to Tacoma, stepped right into the musical activities by being a soloist in "The Messiah" and as a soloist with the Tacoma Choral Society. Mrs. Bertram was very active in operatic groups, singing leads with the "Oakland Light Opera Association and the Berkeley Opera Workshop plus being a member of the San Francisco Opera Company Chorus.

Harry Aldrich—Many Tacomans will remember Harry as the lead in the 1945 Stadium operetta "Wyotana." After serving in World War II, Harry sang with dance bands in and around Aberdeen. This is Harry's first T.L.T. venture and we hope he'll make it a habit. Harry is with Northwest Airlines.

Suzanne Gallaher—Suzanne is one of the many former C.P.S. singers in this year's production. She sang with the "Adelphians" and had leads in "The Telephone," "Trial by Jury" and "Down in the Valley," all at C.P.S. She is soloist with the Christ Episcopal Church Choir and has done a great deal of concert work here in Tacoma.

Persis Shook (Mrs. James)—A graduate of voice from the University of Washington, Mrs. Shook's theatre activities read like a Samuel French catalogue. She has been "Lois" in "Junior Miss," Laura in "The Glass Menagerie" plus leads in "Arsenic and Old Lace," "Tish," "Blossom Time" and "Return of Peter Grimm." At the University, Mrs. Shook was soloist with the University Symphony Orchestra. We certainly hope we'll see much more of her.

Virg Groff—This is Virg's seventh show for T.L.T. He is especially remembered for his part as "Ol' Spettique" in "Charley's Aunt" and as "Nickoff" in "The Merry Widow." In the "Firefly" Virg is going to have to take his own medicine.

Dagny Vaswig—Just listening to her vibrant enthusiasm you realize that the high spot in her life was her appearance on the Kate Smith television show last May 18th. She is appearing in her first T.L.T. production. Dagny studied at the Concordia Conservatory of Music in Fargo, North Dakota, and later in Portland, Oregon, under Madame Frazee.
