

SHEILA VAREY (Audrey Trowbridge)—Shelia's background in drama includes the Showboat and Penthouse Theatres at the U. of Washington, Little Theatre in Albuquerque, and here at T.L.T. in "Affairs of State" and "The Silver Whistle," teamed with Dick Odlin in the latter. She directs the annual Christmas Pageant at a Tacoma church. When not in a play, Sheila's Varey busy backstage. Children, too (2).



DICK ODLIN (Erwin Trowbridge)—What has T.L.T. got that other Little Theatres haven't got? Dick Odlin, of course. To abbreviate on Dick is injustice; to elaborate is impossible (in this space). T.L.T.'s Dramatic Director crosses the footlights here for the first time since his "antics" in "Charlie's Aunt" two years ago. He's worked at Pasadena Playhouse with Victor Mature, Dana Andrews and Robert Preston: in London with Maurice Evans; toured summer stock with Laurette Taylor in "Outward Bound" (one of his most cherished stage experiences); with Ina Claire and Adrienne Ames; with Ann Todd; and with Marie Wilson and Zachary Scott in "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes." Dick also

appeared in the first TV shows in New York. These, of course, are but a few of the facts of an already brilliant career. His "first" at T.L.T. was seven years ago in the same play and same role you're seeing tonight. Others here were "Harvey," "The Silver Whistle" and the aforementioned "Charlie's Aunt." Dick feels, in sincere modesty (Odlin ain't maudlin), that few parts are "right" for him. He prefers directing to acting, and sums it up, "Tacoma has an amazing amount of excellent non-professional talent, and it's a thrilling experience to be director here." That's the same way Tacoma feels about Dick Odlin, except to delete the "non."



FRANCIS BUSBY (Clarence Dobbins)—Here's a man who isn't lost in the shadows of his talented and attractive wife (herself a talented performer and director of this play). He's an Account Executive at KTNT-TV. We've seen him in "Detective Story," "Aaron Slick of Pumpkin Creek," "Dinner at Eight" and "Sabrina Fair," all in the past two years. He's also active in backstage work.
