

REAR ADMIRAL CHARLES WEEKS (Alfred Munson) was technical adviser for "The Caine Mutiny," and well qualified, we'd say, having retired last July 30th after 30 years' service in the Navy. We think you'll agree with Dick Odlin that he's well cast for this, his first acting role—and a "brand new experience." He consented to take the part when his wife promised to coach him, although it puts a "crimp" in his plans to launch a new venture as representative of a Seattle investment firm.
