favorite role: Birdie, in The Little Foxes, last season. The Jones boys (2) are following her avid interest in drama; one studying drama at U. of W. Both have appeared here.

SUSAN BAILEY (Marie Louise) — Hey, fellas . . . this doll has 2 fascinating pre-fixes: 1. "Miss," and 2. "Hillside" (0486). Susan is considering a dramatic career, and already has the following impressive background: Voice student of Frank Nurdin, acrobatics, ballet (figuratively speaking, she has the ballet build), modeling (New York Modeling Studio, Seattle), and in plays (Lincoln High and T.L.T.). If you saw Time Of The Cuckoo last season, she was that cute maid. Susan's future hopes include dramatic study in New York, night club singing, and TV. Well, she has 2 important requisites: Poise and curls.

ERNESTINE HEITMAN (Mme. Parole)—Ernestine's the "heit" of something or other . . . our guess is it's determination. She's

She's also an authoress (the popular children's book, "Rosy The Skunk," featuring Rosy Jasmine eau de cologne!) Lists as hobbies: Writing books and "jingles," and music (plays piano and pipe organ). This is Ernestine's debut at T.L.T. Welcome aboard!

WALLACE SCOTT (Joseph)—Wally is serious minded enough to be a history teacher at Lincoln High, and extrovert enough to enjoy everything in life. He finds drama a "delightful recreation," and has a past record of some 35 plays in school, Lakewood Players, and here. Remember him in The Little Foxes and Time Of The Cuckoo? In high school his hair-line was voted "Most Likely To Recede" Thumbnail review of Wally: "Great Scott."

GENE SKIDMORE (Jules)—Don't let the name fool you . . . he's no "re-tread." T.L.T. gets good mileage out of Skidmore

(no low-pressure, no squealing on curves). If the stage crew needs a whitewall, he'll paint it. Gene owns a fabulous record in our theatre: 15 consecutive shows since September, 1953, doing stage lighting, as stage manager, or on stage (in some plays, all 3). Works another 8 to 10 hours a day at 6th Avenue Rental Equipment, a real friend of this theatre for needed equipment (without the rental fee, mind you). 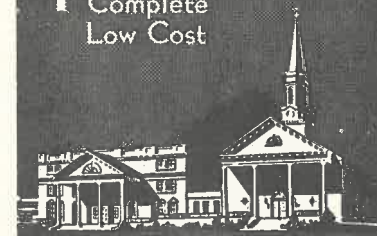
