SHEILA VAREY (The Girl)—One of TLT's most talented and versatile actresses, Sheila was last seen in "Three Men on a Horse", "Affairs of State", and "Silver Whistle". Backstage activities also keep Sheila busy, because she enjoys every aspect of theatre work. And, by the way, for the last two years Sheila has also directed the Sunday School pageant at St. Luke's. Another busy cast member is . . .

MARGARET ZAFERIN (Wowle)—Margaret works during the day at Mt. Rainier Ordnance Depot, but during her spare time she finds time to sing with the Tacoma Choral Society, and to take part in the activities at the Little Theatre. You've seen Margaret in "Song of Norway", "Smilin' Thru", "Goodbye My Fancy" and "Strange Bedfellows" . . . just to name a few. Another cast member you've seen and enjoyed many times before is . . .

VERN PEARSON (Johnson)—An actor of many talents, you've seen Vern as the warped detective in "Detective Story", the sincere and revered "Mr. Roberts", and the romantic lead in "Born Yesterday". Tonight Vern shows another facet of his capabilities. A member of the Little Theatre Play Selection Committee, Vern has also taken part in many of our play reviews. 

An avid camera fan, Len spent 11 years in the Merchant Marines—and then he got drafted! The only places in the world he has not seen are Russia and Alaska—and he has a sneaking hunch the
