

HARRY ALDRICH (Billy) Harry's rich, true voice has thrilled audiences twice before at the Little Theatre—in "Firefly" and "Song of Norway." Harry works for the City Fire Department here in Tacoma, and he enjoys his musical hobby all year by singing in two churches and also with the Cleft Dwellers.

MILT THOMPSON (Billy) A favorite of Little Theatre audiences, Milt is playing in his fourth musical tonight. Besides appearing in "Firefly," "Song of Norway" and "Irene," Milt was also seen in our production of "Sabrina Fair." Milt, by the way, is past president of the Cleft Dwellers.

VERNON PEARSON (Jigger) Long noted as one of TLT's most sensitive actors, this is Vern's first appearance in a musical. Having sung in quartets since high school, and choirs since he was old enough to wear long pants, Vern has been wanting to be in a musical for years, and this show was his first chance. An active member of the Little Theatre, Vern serves on the Executive Committee, and has acted in such shows as "Detective Story" and "Mr. Roberts."

DON LEMON (Jigger) Every time Don is in a show, we feel obliged to give a building report on the home he is constructing for him and his wife. This year's report: the pile of siding is gradually getting placed on the house! As a biographical report, Don has been in two other musicals, "Firefly" and "Song of Norway," and one play, "Time of the Cuckoo." Don's musical ambition is to some day play in "South Pacific."

CAROL SELLECK (Carrie) Carol hails from Cleveland, Ohio, and came to Tacoma only last fall as a Special Music Teacher for the Tacoma Public Schools. It seems she wanted to live somewhere on the West Coast so she looked through an AAA travel folder. Under Tacoma she saw that we had a daffodil festival every March and she figured that any place that had daffodils in March must be a pretty good place to live. Carol comes to us with four years of stock experience, three in non-professional theatre and one year with an equity company. She was also in a chorus with Bob Shaw in San Diego last summer.

CAROL SANDFORD (Carrie) Two years ago Carol arrived in Tacoma from Ireland. One spring last year Margaret Jones brought Carol down to the Theatre to try out for "Irene." The directors heard her

and immediately cast her in the lead. Men from CPS saw her in the role and in a short time she had a music scholarship at the College. All in all, we'd say the Theatre has been good for Carol . . . and Carol definitely has been good for the Theatre!

PERSIS SHOOK (Nettie) This is Persis' third character role in her third musical. Versatility is the keynote of this girl's talents. Persis is a special music teacher for the Tacoma Public Schools during the day and during her "spare" time she rides herd over her three growing youngsters. She is also a soloist at Christ Episcopal Church.

JEANNE SANDERS (Nettie) Here's another newcomer to the TLT boards, and another cast member who is realizing a life-time ambition in being in a musical. Jeanne came down to tryouts just to accompany some of the singers, and so goes the tale. Jeanne used to teach music at Jason Lee and she now teaches piano at home and is soloist at the Christian Science Church at Lakewood.

WAYNE HOGAN (Mr. Snow) You'll remember Wayne from his portrayal of Grieg in "Song of Norway" two years ago. Now Wayne returns to do his first character role at TLT. During his student days, Wayne had the opportunity of singing the lead in "Fidelio," and he studied under Chuck Lawrence and August Werner. A successful business man now, he manages the Food King at Lakewood.

CLARK CRUST (Mr. Snow) Clark arrived in Tacoma just a year ago from Montana where he was active in many charity shows, the "Follies of 1955 in Montana," the Montana Men's Group which toured the South in '54, and he also had tenor leads in quite a few Gilbert and Sullivan shows. Since coming here he has become a member of the Cleft Dwellers and he's tenor soloist at the Little Church on the Prairie.

MARGARET JONES (Mrs. Mullen) When you speak of Maggie Jones, you speak of theatre in its best sense. Maggie is not only one of TLT's finest actresses (remember her in "The Little Foxes" and "Ponder Heart"), she is also one of TLT's hardest workers. She's long been a member of the Board of Directors of the theatre. This year finds her also on the Play Selection Committee, and as many casts can verify, you can't beat Maggie as an assistant director. All in all, you name it, Maggie has done it—and well!
