

**JOHN GAYTON (Captain Fisby)** is "all over the place" in our theatre. Onstage: you detested his villainy in "Dial M for Murder," but applauded his more sympathetic roles in "Sabrina" and "Kind Sir." John's classic features are no detriment to him!

**CHARLES (CHICK) GUILFORD (Col. Wainright Purdy III)** has plenty of fans. He will be remembered as "Doc" in "Mr. Roberts" and as "Uncle Henri" in "My Three Angels." Further: he directed the play reading of "Reclining Figure." He is a member of our theatre's board of directors.

**DON WILLIAMS (Capt. McLean)**, relatively a newcomer to Tacoma, makes his initial bow to LT audiences in this play . . . of which he says, "My wife probably will be my only fan!"

**PATRICK STEELE (Sgt. Gregovich)** has "carried a few spears" in previous TLT productions, among them "First Lady," "Mr. Roberts," and "Girl of the Golden West." Also appeared in the olio with "The Tavern."

**ARLENE LEDDY (the "Old Woman")** dotes on character bits. Only typhoid fever kept her from the part for which she was cast in "Twentieth Century." Backstage she's worked on props, costumes and set construction.

**JOHN BUCHANAN (Mr. Sumata)** made his first appearance in our Little Theatre ten years ago—in the Children's Theatre! A term at Pasadena Playhouse changed his ambition from stage to radio, for which he is now studying at Tacoma Vocational School.

**RENO ODLIN (Mr. Oshira)** has "dabbled" in LT activities for the past two years: backstage, he's often manipulating the lights; offstage, was a "voice" in "Dial M for Murder"; onstage, he hid behind the "Second Beard" in "Twentieth Century."

**ED MINEGHETTI (Mr. Hokaida)** has not taken part in any previous dramatic production, but while at CPS was a member of the Adelphian Choir. Studied radio speech at Broadway Edison in Seattle.

**FLO HEATON (Old Woman's Daughter)** has had limited experience in our Little Theatre—on the "spectator side of the curtain! Her initiation in "Teahouse" may inspire her to try out for parts in future plays.

*Things are beginning to happen . . . .*

in these paragraphs we've been making an appeal for donors to the Tacoma Little Theatre Building Fund. "What's the status, and what progress is being made on improvements and enlargements?" Fair question — so let's throw a little light on the subject. A committee of Salem Nourse, Herb Love, Ted Hill and Dr. M. J. Wicks, Chairman, (you'll be hearing more of him later) has been studying improvements for the stage lighting system — a badly needed item. Already the TLT Board of Directors has earmarked \$5,000 for the project and sometime during the summer, the switchboard will be completely renewed, bringing its efficiency and versatility up to standards required by our current productions.
