

for this well-known Tacoman and she says
she has met some of the "finest people I
know right in this Little Theatre group."

BOB GLASS (Alexander Lord) "The Philadelphia Story" is the story of Bob's dramatic experience, but like so many hundreds of others, he's sold on this show house. Born in Dallas, Texas, he came to Tacoma in 1947, is a graduate of Bellarmine High School and Seattle University, and now is an account executive for Radio Station KTAC. We think you'll agree that we need more newcomers like this in our theatre.

LARRY MORTIMER (Thomas) Originally from Utah, by way of California, the "Tacoma Story" of Larry includes roles in "Twin Beds," "Dinner at Eight," and "20th Century." Employed by Hansen & Rowland, he has found pleasure from his work at TLT because of the "interesting people whom you meet."
