The authors tell us . . .

"Inherit the Wind is not history. The events which took place in Dayton, Tennessee, during the scorching July of 1925 are clearly the genesis of this play. It has, however, an exodus entirely its own. Only a handful of phrases have been taken from the actual transcript of the famous Scopes trial. Some of the characters of the play are related to the colorful figures in that battle of the giants; but they have life and language of their own—and, therefore, names of their own. The collision of Bryan and Darrow at Dayton was dramatic. Moreover, the issues of their conflict have acquired new dimensions and meaning in the thirty-three years since they clashed at the Rhea County Courthouse."

The director of the Tacoma Little Theatre and the performers have not attempted to edit the play as it was written. Realizing that its content was and is controversial, every attempt has been made to present the play in factual form devoid of individual interpretation locally. Therefore nothing in this play should be construed as the thinking pro or con of any person connected with the Tacoma Little Theatre, more especially this production of "Inherit the Wind."
