

He thinks he has arrived in time to see the Civil War—which, he thinks, will be fun—but, has misjudged his time and arrives in 1959. Where he comes from, civilization has gone far beyond what we have here. What the stranger observes is often very funny because it is so obviously average. He is enchanted with all the new playthings that the 20th Century has invented for war-making, and wants to toss a few of them around and make his own war. He thinks a few people should be happy to die for his amusement; and it takes the combined action of the entire cast, including a general who wants to go back to the laundry, to persuade him to call off his war.

"Visit to a Small Planet" was written for an hour television show; but proved to be so unusually popular that Playwright Gore Vidal was persuaded to use the subject matter for a full evening's entertainment.




