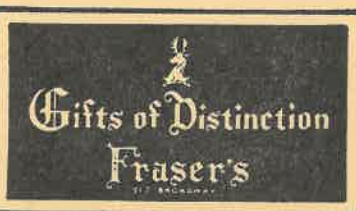

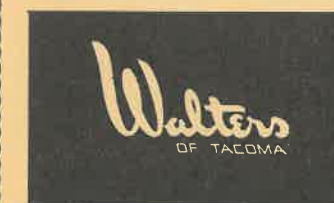

## OF SHAKESPEARE, WORDS AND COLORS

In the squalid Cannaregio district of Venice stands the Church of S. Giobbe, named for Job of the Scriptures. In it is a noble tombstone, which was designed to honor Cristoforo Moro, an illustrious doge of Venice from 1462 to 1471 whose reign saw the introduction of Gutenberg's printing press to Venice. A doge was not permitted to leave the confines of the Republic. For this reason it is believed that ninety years later the Ferrarese story writer Cinzio, to whom plot credit is due for Shakespeare's Othello, created his Otello (without the "h" added by Shakespeare) so that much of the action could occur at the island of Cyprus, then held by the Venetians. However, he had the late doge in mind as the hero who became Otello the Moro in Cinzio's story and "the Moor of Venice" in Shakespeare's play.

The Italian word Moro means black and is derived from Latin *maurus* which was later applied to Moslems, principally in northwestern Africa, who invaded Spain in the eighth century and became known as Saracenes. The various modern derivatives of "maurus" never crossed the path of Latin "niger"—meaning black—from which our word Negro has emerged. Thus, although "Moor" suggests a dark complexion, the Venetian doge to whose name the color confusion can be traced, was no more of brown or black skin, as Joe Brown or Justice Black. Oddly enough our word "blackamoor" means African Negro, and not necessarily Moslem, as suggested by its "moor" component. Perhaps some day we will have more definite knowledge about the Moor of Venice at which time, to quote from Shakespeare's Julius Caesar, "Good reason must, of force, give place to better."

## WHO'S WHO

**GREG KELLY (Gratiano)**, psychology major from the University of California, is now in the army at Fort Lewis. He has performed with Lakewood Players in "Playboy of the Western World" and plans to return to school as soon as he is out of uniform. Meantime, he's enjoying the chance of working with Director Bernard Frawley in a Shakespearean production.

**Emilia:** Othello gives **MARY JEAN FINNEGAN** her first part at TLT, though she has been seen frequently with other Tacoma theater groups. Away from her work in a Tacoma bank or at any of several Tacoma theater groups, one will most likely find her on a golf course or bowling.

**JOAN TEACHMAN (Desdemona)** took 8 years off between college, which she attended on a drama scholarship, and her return to theater in TLT'S "Look Homeward, Angel" and "Brigadoon" in which she sang the lead. Meantime she married, became the mother of two children, and pursued her hobby of writing short stories and informal essays. She thanks "my patient and understanding husband, Norman" for the opportunity to take part in "Othello."

**DICK DOSSETT (Cassio)** probably got the earliest start in entertainment of the entire cast. He had his own radio program in San Antonio when he was 10 years old. He earned plaudits for outstanding performances in TLT musicals and in "Taming of the Shrew" and has just completed a performance in a special church film.

**F. R. (BUD) McCALL (Othello)** may be better known for his painting for this marks his first performance in Tacoma for ten years. He has performed in professional theater in California and will leave Tacoma next year for England and Ireland for further study and work in theater there. The beard is real.

**DR. ROY WRIGHT (Lodovico)** claims he backed into theater and can't get enough of it. He was talked into reading for a part last year when he accompanied his wife to a tryout and got it. He is a veterinarian and enjoys painting and fencing when his four-footed patients give him the chance.

**BILL McMENAMIN (Brabantio)** comes to "Othello" after many outstanding performances in TLT musicals and in "Taming of the Shrew." He's in the real estate business and also directs the "Totemaires," a barbershop quartet and sings with a second foursome.

**MAUREEN FOLEY (Bianco)** has played a lead in Shakespeare before . . . Shylock. She comes from Dublin and an Irish theatrical family. She is the fourth in her family to choose the stage for a career. "Othello" marks her sixth show since coming to Tacoma with her husband Bernard (who incidentally is director of this production) and is her second Shakespearean performance. Her first was "Shylock" because there were no boys in the convent school she attended in Ireland.

**DAVE BROWN (Roderigo)** has more directing than acting "credits to his credit." He directed for Lakewood Players, Suburban Showcase and the summer Arts for Youth Festival. This summer he presented his own group of one-acts at a Tacoma night club and has just completed direction of Tony Karloff in a new recording of "Christmas Carol" which will be heard in Tacoma on KTAC Dec. 23 and 25.

**TOM BARRY (Senator)** got his feet wet in theater while in the U.S. Navy where he took part in USO productions. After graduation from college in business administration he joined IBM in Tacoma. Outside of working hours, and "Othello" hours, he enjoys hunting and fishing.

Rolly said if this were true he wouldn't have had time to work for IBM and appear in "Doll's House," "Golden Fleecing," "Look Homeward, Angel" (in which he took a part on one day's notice) and "Brigadoon" besides serving as stage lighting chairman. He does have one son.

**PAUL BENSON (Montano)** is a veteran of numerous TLT and Lakewood productions, his most recent "The Pleasure of His Company." He is Regional Planning Coordinator for the State Department of Commerce and Economic Development. His wife, Elizabeth, is also an actress and a singer.
