RICKY BOUDREAU (Nicky Hampton) — Four and a half-foot, fourteen-year-old Ricky, born in Inglewood, New Jersey, has also appeared in "Damn Yankees" and "Wizard of Oz." He is presently concentrating on his studies at Jason Lee Junior High School. Rick plays the drums in his spare time.

LENNIE SAUNDERS (Addie Cromwell Hampton) When asked if she had thought of the theatre as a career, Lennie replied, "Not since I was twelve." Having just moved here from Seattle, this is her first appearance at TLT. Seattle's loss is our gain. Welcome, Lennie.

LOUIS TALCOTT (Mayor Tibbett)—If you saw the musical, "Brigadoon," last season, you will remember Louie as the lovable Mr. Lundie. The Driftwood Players in Aberdeen are familiar with his work in "Pajama Game" and "Oklahoma." Right now he is busy studying Radio Broadcasting at the Tacoma Vocational School.

SHUN LING (Ling)—This is a first for Mr. Ling. His first play and his first time at TLT. He is a graduate of the University of Washington in Civil Engineering. The name, Ling, is purely coincidental. We hope you will like it here, Shun.

ADEL HALL (Julia Cromwell)—A new and pleasant face to the Tacoma area, Adel and her husband, a Warrant Officer stationed at Fort Lewis, recently moved here from Germany. The little theatre, however, is not new to her, having helped start two of them herself. Her stage credits include "Picnic," "Blythe Spirit" and "Auntie Mame." Nice to have you here, Mrs. Hall.

DICK MONAGHAN (Matthew Cromwell)—Dick can be seen almost any time of the day or night in Federal Court—as a TNT Reporter. Mr. Monaghan has used his quick wit in such productions as "Solid Gold Cadillac" and "Moon Is Blue" for Lakewood Players. This is the first time for him on the TLT stage. Dick also directs when he's not on the stage.

CONSTANCE McCLAREN (Beulah)—Is a newcomer from California. She has been living here only five months. Most of Connie's performances have been in the foyer so this is her first time on our stage.

GEORGIE BODHAINE (Mrs. Worley)—This is Georgie's second at TLT, her first being "The Women." The stage seems to run in her family. She has three uncles, a producer, a writer and a director, active in Hollywood.

ARLENE LEDDY (Mrs. Gimble)—Not an unfamiliar face to TLT goers, this is Arlene's eighth role on this stage, one of these being "Inherit the Wind." "Our Town" was one of her performances for Lakewood Players. She is a playwright also with one three-act under her belt.

She has done many things for Lakewood Players, such as "The Man in the Dog Suit" and "Crucible."

PAT CHAPMAN (Gifford Hampton) — It was 1949 when Pat saw his first action at TLT and since has played in every theatre group ever active in Tacoma. This season he has appeared in "Solid Gold Cadillac" and the review for "Suddenly This Summer" as well as being assistant director for "Othello." Pat wants to be a director professionally.

PETE VALE (Vincent Pemberton) — Peter, a freshman at Bellarmine High School, has studied for one year at the TLT Junior Theatre. This is his first adult play. He wants to be an Ophthalmologist (eye doctor).
