## WHO'S WHO

By ARLENE LEDDY

**GEORGI BODHAINE (Lorraine)**—In playing the glamorous "other woman" in this play Georgi is taking a mighty long step from her last role. A few weeks ago, in "Strange Bedfellows," Georgi hid her youth and looks behind clever make-up and good acting to play a jittery, grey-haired old lady, Mrs. Worley. She is married and has two little boys. Georgi enjoys a variety of parts, she says.

**MARK HIPKINS (Ferelli)**—Giving Mark the role of Ferelli, the designer, is type-casting of the best kind. Not that Mark designs dresses, but he can design—and has—just about anything else. He carves, when he has time. And many faithful TLT theatre-goers remember with pleasure some of the sets he designed for TLT in the past. He's back after a long absence, and welcome.

**NADINE DRYDEN (Frances Goodwin)**—This is Nadine's first purely dramatic role. But this doesn't mean she is new to theatrical ambition. Her father made her a stage of her own when she was small. Her first role since school days was a singing one in Brigadoon. Though she has two boys, Nadine squeezes out enough time to study harp and singing in Seattle twice a week. She says she is longing to play Miriam in The Music Man.

**ROLAND OPSAHL (Max Pincus)**—As the business man Pincus, Rollie just misses being type-cast, for he works for IBM, a well-known business firm if ever there was one. He has done several parts for both Lakewood Players and Tacoma Little Theatre. For the latter he appeared in "Look Homeward, Angel," "Doll's House," "Brigadoon," and both Shakespeare plays.

**LENNIE BULEN (Miriam Oppenheim)**—Lennie was last seen at TLT in "Strange Bedfellows." She played the flighty Addie, wife of the Englishman Gifford. She says she likes any kind of part; it's all grist to the mill. In private life Lennie works as a switchboard operator and receptionist at Reichhold Chemical Co.

**MARILYN WOTTON (Carol)**—As one of the dress models Marilyn is playing her first stage role. However, as assistant to the director for "Strange Bedfellows," she has worked behind the scenes at TLT. Marilyn has also worked backstage for Lakewood Players. She is looking forward to the wonderful clothes scheduled for wearing by the models.

**KENNETH HOSIE (Marty)**—This is Kenneth's first serious role. He has done several comedy parts and likes farce best. Kenneth says he would like to try some Shakespeare. On a scholarship he will major in drama at college—which one he isn't certain yet. Like "Marty," Kenneth is seventeen.

**PAT CHAPMAN (Miles Lewis)**—Pat declares the usual facts about him have been printed too often to bear repeating. So he wants to give us other true(?) but less-known facts about himself. His favorite role is the knight in Twelfth (k)Night, and he is anxious to play the title role in Harvey; that is, if he can get away long enough from his job with the U.S. Space Agency. While flying our astronauts have to keep track of all the Russian sputniks, and Pat rides on the rocket's nose cone, points, and says, "They went thataway."
