GEORGI BODHAINE (Peggy Evans)—Georgi's husband must have named his Jet Auto Wrecking Co. after his wife, as she not only takes care of home and three youngsters—the youngest, Suzanne, being only two months old—but acts, works on props, paints scenery, and makes the coffee for actors and crew backstage. Georgi claims she is famous—or perhaps notorious is the word we want here—for her dreadful backstage coffee. Whenever the java is particularly awful the folks working in or on the play go around muttering, "Oh Lord, Bodhaine's Borgia Brew again!" and similar friendly things.

NEIL O'LEARY (Buddy Baker)—Neil's first part at TLT was in Shakespeare's "Taming Of The Shrew," in which he was a page, member of the crowd, etc. This classic beginner's part in a classic play was very appropriate for Neil, as he is taking the Honor Classical Course—Greek, Latin, Physics—at Bellarmine High School, and is interested in classic studies of all kinds. He has appeared in school plays, but enjoyed directing "The Ninth Guest" more than acting. Neil has also acted for the Tacoma Arts for Youth organization.

BERNARD TOLAN (Mr. Baker)—As Mr. Baker Bernard is enjoying his first role at TLT. In fact, he is not only new to TLT, he calls himself a newcomer to Tacoma, too, he and his family having been here only two years. However, he has had theatre experience in Hudson, Ohio. He has played Desmond Bonnard in "Happy Time," the mayor in "Inspector General," and the captain in "Mr. Roberts." He says he likes a variety of roles. Bernard teaches Math at Charles Wright school.

JULIE MARSHALL (Connie Dayton)—Julie comes to this play fresh from a part in "The Drunkard" at Steve's Gay Nineties Restaurant. She played a kookie character called Agnes. The part of glamorous Connie is a return to her usual type role, as Julie has played glamorous women—generally wicked ones—in dozens of TLT plays. She says she has two favorites—Crystal, in "The Women," and the beautiful Chinese woman in "The Letter," a part which has no spoken lines, but is intensely emotional. This time Julie is chortling up her sleeve because—at last—she is the "Good Gal" who gets to keep the hero, instead of losing him at the last minute. Besides theatre, Julie finds time for other hobbies, such as painting, skin diving, and water-skiing.

BEVERLY SCOGGIN (Mrs. Baker)—Beverly's roles at TLT have included Marie Pert in "Look Homeward Angel," Flo Owens in "Picnic," and Mrs. Jacobi in "A Majority of One." She says she likes comedy best but enjoys any good role; also enjoys being a trustee on the board of trustees of the "Opera House Players," the group which puts on the plays at Steve's Gay Nineties. In private life Beverly teaches kindergarten at the Fife school. She has been teaching for ten years, two in the kindergarten. Beverly also has five children of her own.

LES HOUE (Alan Baker)—Les didn't want to talk about himself—he tells us he doesn't like to be eulogized. But his modesty won't prevent TLT buffs from remembering his many fine performances, such as his portrayal of Drummond in "Inherit the Wind." This role as everyone knows, is a thinly disguised description of Clarence Darrow and his part in the Scopes trial in Tennessee. For 30 years, he has been connected, more or less, with theatre. Besides being an actor in his spare time, Les also writes and directs.
