WHO'S WHO

DOROTHY JEAN HEFFERNAN (Opal). To list the qualifications and accomplishments of this gal would take up more space than is devoted to the whole "Who's Who" section of our program so we will be as brief as possible.

She is the daughter of Steve Pease of "Steve's Gay Nineties" spot in South Tacoma and performs there as a singer and dancer.

Digging back into our records we find her making her first appearance on our stage in September 1951 as Congresswoman Agatha Reed in "Goodbye My Fancy," at which time she was Dorothy Jean Pease and it was none other than Virg Langdon, venerable reviewer for the Tacoma News Tribune, who said it was just too bad we didn't have any talent scouts visit our town and that Dorothy's meritorious performance at least warranted a screen test. Time marched on. She majored in drama and graduated from University of Pacific in Stockton, Cal., and then received her Master's degree in English at Arizona State. She played in the Little Theatre in Phoenix, Ariz., followed by two years in Summer Stock. On returning to Tacoma she was engaged to handle the Language Arts at the Junior High School level in the then newly inaugurated program of television teaching for Tacoma schools.

In 1961 she appeared on our boards in "The Golden Fleecing" and in 1962 did Bianca in "Taming of the Shrew." While Opal probably never heard of Shakespeare, Dorothy is a lover of the classics and feels they should be done more often.

And incidentally, she directed "The Drunkard" which just completed a very successful run at "Steve's" and a little bird tells us it is to be repeated in the near future.

ED STEELE (appearing as Prof. Bradford Winter) is not a stranger to TLT audiences, having to his credit parts in "Desk Set," "The Ponder Heart," "Inherit the Wind," "Witness for the Prosecution," "Teahouse of the August Moon"

and his most recent success was as Doctor Alden in this season's howling comedy "Roman Candle."

Ed is married, has three grown daughters and a son, and believe it or not, he is also a grand-daddy.

The monetary rewards as an actor with TLT being less than nil, he has to work for others to keep the wolf from the door and has for some time been employed as an accountant for Wagner-Robinson Co. who specialize in accounting and bookkeeping for small business establishments such as gas stations, garages, etc.

JIM GIBSON (The Doctor). Jim has made several appearances on our stage in the past three years, among them "South Pacific," "The Golden Fleecing," "Taming of the Shrew," in which he did three characters, and last appeared as a song and dance man in last season's production of "Showboat."

He is now married but continues his hobby of painting in oils. He teaches math at Stewart Intermediate, is a member of the Clef Dwellers. He isn't so sure about Shakespeare but concedes that it has a place in the entertainment field.

PATRICK M. CHAPMAN (Sol Bozo). Pat, as he is known by all and probably appears in the program under that monicker, made his initial appearance with TLT in 1949 and since that time has been identified with every theatre group that has played in and about Tacoma. His last appearance on our boards was in April-May 1963 as "Miles Lewis" in "The Fifth Season." Pat works(?) for the American Plumbing & Steam Supply Co. and where he finds time for his various activities is something to ponder. He has long had a yen to play the title role in Harvey but alas, that has not as yet come to pass. However his other ambition to become a director was recently fulfilled when

he directed and produced "Raisin in the Sun" for "Town & Gown" at Bellarmine this past year. His yen for the theatre is a natural as his father and mother were both active in TLT activities many years ago.

LENNIE BULEN (Gloria Gulock). This seems to be the third appearance of this gal on the TLT stage. She is a graduate of Hi-Line in Seattle, came to Tacoma about a year or so ago and made her first appearance in "Strange Bedfellows," in which production she was billed as "Lennie Saunders." That was in February 1963. In April, same year, she played in "The Fifth Season" as "Lennie Bulen," and so she is in the current show. What's in a name anyhow? Asked by another scribe not too long ago if she had ever thought of the theatre as a career, she replied, "Not since I was twelve." That wasn't too long ago. She also intimated that her current ambition was to have fun, sport and amusement—and I'll bet she does.

RICHARD CARMAN (Joe Jankee, Policeman). The J's are pronounced as Y's so his name becomes Yoe Yankee. This is his first appearance with TLT. He graduated from Puyallup Hi last year. Took part in a number of school plays in various capacities including directing and, in addition to his policeman chores in this show, he is also stage manager which is not an easy chore for a young fellow.

He's single, lives in Puyallup and is presently in the employ of the Forestry Department and engaged in reforestation. Says he likes it very much.

MR. HOLLINGSWORTH is just an alley cat that adopted the back stage of TLT some years ago as sort of a second home. Nobody knows his name or to whom he belongs. Suffice to say he more than pays his way in keeping the rodent population to a minimum. Whether he eats 'em or just scares them away makes no difference—they are conspicuous by their absence and Mr. Hollingsworth is now accepted as a full fledged member of the back-stage crew. Suppose he could be waiting for Walt Disney to discover him?
