JUDY DEAN, who plays Maria, is in her first speak-
 ing part for T.L.T., although she was in the chorus
 of **Show Boat**. At Annie Wright Seminary, where she
 graduated a few years ago, she played Mrs. Higgins
 in **Pygmalion**. Right now she is majoring in English
 and Education at U.P.S., and planning on being a
 teacher in our Secondary schools. Stay with us, Judy.

JOHN KELLER grays his hair a bit, and that right
 effectively, to play Dr. Sloper. Originally, John came
 from the East, but he earned his BA in Drama at
 San Francisco State College, and was working on his
 Master's when "Greetings" came from Uncle Sam.
 So now, happily for us, John is at Fort Lewis. John
 has played Summer Stock at Arden, Delaware, in
 Colorado, and at Carmel Valley. A few of his vehicles
 were **Time Remembered**, **The Rehearsal** (which his
 group, incidentally, produced a year before it ap-
 peared on Broadway), **Waltz of the Toreadors**, and
 several musicals, among them **West Side Story** and
Fantastic. Let's hope John doesn't get transferred.

MAGGIE JONES, who plays Aunt Lavinia Penniman,
 is so well known to T.L.T. audiences that there isn't
 much more we can tell. She, her husband Carl, and
 their two sons have worked busily back-stage and
 on-stage for 10, these many years. Maggie has worked
 with the Lakewood Theatre and Summer Theatre
 groups, too. It would take more than our available
 space to list all the plays in which Maggie has par-
 ticipated—suffice it to say they are legion. In addi-
 tion to her other activities, this year she will be
 directing our Junior Theatre.

JOAN TEACHMAN, in the title role, went to Everett
 Junior College on a Drama scholarship, after having
 had her own singing radio show in Everett. Marriage
 and two small children kept Joan too busy for either
 Drama or Music for a few years, but she has found
 time since **LOOK HOMEWARD, ANGEL**, her first play
 for T.L.T., to do Fiona in **BRIGADOON** and Desdemona
 in **OTHELLO**. For about a year Joan has been singing
 with The Clef Dwellers, the local group that contrib-
 utes so much to our musicals each Spring.

ETHEL WHEATLEY, (Elizabeth Almond), hails from
 Washington, D.C., where she graduated from the
 Speech and Drama Department of Catholic Univer-
 sity. C.U. alumna include several notables in the
 world of the theatre, among them singer Betty Madi-
 gan, actress Bibi Osterwald, and playwright Jean
 Kerr. Ethel participated actively in many of the
 seventy-odd theatre groups in and around The Capi-
 tol City, and in fact met her husband through fellow
 cast-members of one such group. Some of her favor-
 ite roles, prior to assuming that of Mrs. James
 Wheatley, were Laura Partridge in **THE SOLID GOLD**
CADILLAC, Mrs. Savage in **THE CURIOUS SAVAGE**, and
 Big Mama in **CAT ON A HOT TIN ROOF**. The Wheat-
 leys came from one Washington to the other three
 months ago, when he joined the staff of the Family
 Service of Tacoma. They like the Northwest and look
 forward to remaining here, as we do to having them
 stay and continue participation in T.L.T. activities.

"THE HEIRESS"

"The Heiress" was first presented on the boards of Tacoma Little Theatre in September, 1950. It was played by a cast including Salem A.
