WHO'S WHO

SPIKE ODLIN (Paul Sevigne) — You last saw Spike as "The Rainmaker" and what a delightful spoofer he was. Spike is the kind of actor who can play any type role. In contrast to his role in "Rainmaker," he played an ancient Okinawan gentleman in "Teahouse of the August Moon." Spike has been away from the theatre too long but this season we have a bonus in having him for two shows. Let's hope every season is Spike'd with his talents.

DOUGLAS TUCKER (Morestan) — This is Doug's first show at TLT. Previously he played Li'l Abner at Seattle Center Playhouse. He likes acting as much as water skiing, maybe more. He is the father of 20-month-old Debbie. His wife helps him with cues but has no acting inspirations. They met while he was in the Air Force at McChord Field and she worked in the office there. He now toils days at Singer.

DAVID ISAACSON (Lablache) — Dave not only acts, but paints. If you saw the last show you saw some of his work in the portrait of Charles. He is also chairman for scenic painting this season. Dave has been on stage for 34 years, both as an amateur and a professional. He did three years of live TV with the Children's Theatre in Boston during the early days of television.

Dave has been working hard lately at the Social Security office but this hasn't kept him away from the theatre. Let's hope it never will, as Dave is a nice guy to have around.

CONNIE KOZEL (Antoinette Sevigne) — This is Connie's first show anywhere. Except, she adds, as a witch which she played in sixth grade. She figures that doesn't count. She says she just went to tryouts and got the part. (Note to aspiring actors. See, it isn't so hard.) Besides acting, Connie likes to ski and play tennis. Working hours find her at Lindstrom's Decorating Center. Connie is a home grown product, graduating from Stadium in 1963.

FRANCEA WAX (Josefa Lantenay) — Fran (short for Francea, not Frances) is another '63 grad, only of Lincoln, and this is also her first TLT show. Her only previous acting experience was her senior class play. Fran works as a dental assistant. To relax after a hard day over a hot drill she reads plays and listens to sound tracks from Broadway shows. Weekends find her on the ski slopes. We think she makes a pretty cute maid and hope to see more of her in the future.

FLO STEELE (Dominique Beaurevers) — Our attractive Dominique made her debut on our stage in "Teahouse of the August Moon" in which she played a beautiful Oriental miss. Since then she has been busy both back stage and on stage. Besides "Teahouse" she has appeared in "Witness for the Prosecution" and "The Heiress." She is currently in charge of stage decor. As if that weren't enough, she also works days at Snelling and Snelling, personnel consultants, and is foster mother to a couple of toy poodles.

C. RAYMOND WIESS (Benjamin Beaurevers) — Although this is his first play in Tacoma, Ray is no stranger to the theatre. He started out years ago in his hometown, Beaumont, Texas, in about 1926. He did a few bit parts in the movies, once appearing with those old screen lovers, Janet Gaynor and Charles Farrell. He also appeared with the Westport Playhouse, in Connecticut. The army claimed him for 24 years and this put an end to his acting. He retired here in 1962, so he could pursue his hobbies of hunting, fishing and golfing. We're glad he did as he has a wealth of theatrical background that will be quite welcome at TLT.

GEORGE SPELVIN (Guard) — This character is played by anyone who happens to be around backstage whom the costume fits. It could be a different person each night. So, if you would know more about him, you'll have to go backstage after the show and find out for yourself.
