PERSIS SHOOK (Reno Sweeney)—The last time Persis took a role here at the Little Theatre, she dyed her hair black (Bloody Mary in "South Pacific"). This time she's lowering her beautiful soprano voice into a rich contralto! Busy is Persis' middle name . . . she has five children from pre-school to 10th grade; she's the soprano soloist at Christ Episcopal; she's a special music teacher for the Tacoma Public Schools, and she's the leader for a troupe of 30 Girl Scouts!

JACK RICHARDSON (Sir Evelyn Oakleigh)—This role is a real switcheroo for Jack . . . as it's more of a comedy role than a singing role. You will remember Jack from many of our musicals . . . this is his eighth TLT show. A life underwriter for Northern Life, Jack has found time in his busy schedule to appear both locally and in Seattle productions.

MINNABEL MARLATT (Mrs. Harcourt)—This pert little gal with the sparkle in her voice first appeared at TLT in "Picnic." Last year you enjoyed her performance in "Annie Get Your Gun" and this year the Opera House Players claimed her talents for two of their melodramas, "No, No A Thousand Times No" and "Dirty Work at the Crossroads."

ELEANOR RACEK (Reno Sweeney)—All who saw Eleanor as Julie in "Showboat" two years ago will be glad to see that she is appearing with us again. Last year Eleanor was the Assistant Music Director for "Annie Get Your Gun" and last December Eleanor and her husband added a new little girl to their growing family, bringing the total up to three girls and one boy!

PAT CHAPMAN (Moonface Martin) — Pat started out his career at TLT in 1949 as one of the four red-headed sons in "Life with Father." Since that time Pat has added 47 more roles to his list of credits, having appeared with every acting group that Tacoma has ever fostered. Pat enjoys all phases of work at our theatre, from season ticket selling to stage lighting.

HERMAN RAU (Billy Crocker)—Last year Herman stepped on stage for the first time in his life when he played the role of Tommy here in "Annie Get Your Gun." This year he did two shows with the Opera House Players and then came here to play the lead in "Anything Goes." Single, Herman is the supervisor of mail and addressing at Weyerhaeuser.

DIANE THOMSON (Hope Harcourt)—When she was just a junior in high school Diane played the lead for us in "Showboat." When she graduated from Stadium last year, she was a member of the Madrigals, voted the most talented girl in the senior class and as the first runner-up in the Miss Tacoma contest. This last year she appeared in "Summer and Smoke" for TLT.

EDNA M. SHILLEY (Mrs. Harcourt)—Edna first sang here in the chorus of "Annie Get Your Gun" . . . but as you can tell from her voice, she is no stranger to music. Edna was a charter member of Clef Dwellers, and is still active with the group. Home life keeps Edna fairly busy, too, as she is the mother of six children . . . five boys and one girl!

KENNETH GRONDAHL (Billy Crocker)—This is Ken's first show at the Tacoma Little Theatre, having moved here from Seattle last year. Ken has been associated with music circles all his life, having sang and toured the state with USO troupes during the war, done Al Jolson imitations, and appeared with the Proscenium Opera Company in Seattle. Employed as a milkman with the Carnation Company, Ken promises, "If you want your milkman to sing to you, just call FU 3-2521!"

SHARRY O'HARE (Bonnie LaTour)—Although Sharry has lived in Tacoma only three years, her list of theatre credits is long and imposing. At the Ft. Lewis Little Theatre, Sharry played in "Carousel," "Amahl and the Night Visitors," "Brigadoon," and "Pajama Game." She has played in three of the Opera House Players melodramas, plus over 50 personal appearances in variety shows and the like. She is also the proud winner of the Miss Congenialty Award in this year's Miss Tacoma Pageant.

DAVID ISAACSON (Sir Evelyn Oakleigh)—This year's director of Scenic Design here at TLT, David first lent TLT his talents last year in "Annie Get Your Gun," when he played in the chorus and painted those beautiful posters that were used in the show. Having appeared in both "Summer and Smoke" and "The Gazebo" here this year, David fills his working hours as a claims clerk for the Social Security.

DIANE COBB (Hope Harcourt)—A 1964 graduate of Lakes High School where she was a member of the Madrigal Club and received an excellent rating in the voice contest, Diane now is a secretary at Weyerhaeuser. While living in Germany (her father is in the service and is presently in Viet Nam) Diane played in "Can Can" and "Guys and Dolls."

CHERYLANNE BARLEY (Bonnie LaTour)—Dance, with a capital D, is Cherylanne's first and only love. To prove it, she commutes each day from Bremerton to dance all day at Jan Collum's Studio, then to TLT each night to play this role, or dance with the dancers in the show. In training for a career in ballet, Cherylanne hopes to go to New York next year.

SHELDON WALTER (Elisha Whitney)—Sheldon first trod our boards in "South Pacific," but he has spent his life participating in theatre up and down the coast. He has just finished playing Buffalo Bill in the Boeing Company production of "Annie Get Your Gun," and he also lists the Shakespearean Festival in Ashland, the Portland Civic Theatre and the Hollywood Radio Chorus among his past activities.

Space will not permit us to write of all the people that will bring "Anything Goes" to life, but special credit must be given to the talented accompanists, hard working crew and the chorus, dancers and directors who will help to bring you this musical tonight.
