Peg, Dale and I have been privileged to work with the singers, actors and accompanists who will entertain you tonight. We saw them for the first time this year when they auditioned for the roles in February, and have watched them grow into a smooth functioning and compatible group whose dedication and talent has never ceased to amaze us. It is a fun experience to renew some old acquaintances and to welcome into the fold a few happy new voices and faces.

Would you like to know some especially interesting things about the members of this cast?

HAROLD HILL and MARIAN PAROO: JIM GIBSON, DAGNEY VASWIG, RAY WHEELER and SUSAN WELLS. The singing and acting ability of both Jim and Dagney is well known to all of us. The Vaswig family has recently purchased its second motorized sailing ship built to special specifications by a group of Viking boat builders in Norway. It was delivered to Puget Sound in the spring pre-dawn darkness by a Norwegian freighter from which it was launched. The boat, with full wooden hull, has a distinctive Nordic look.
