"THE SLEEPING PRINCE"

(Next attraction at T.L.T.)

In this most interesting play by Terence Rattigan, Michael Redgrave and Barbara Bel Geddes starred on Broadway. The story has to do with the Prince Regent of Carpathia, in London for the coronation of King George V, who has arranged for a midnight supper with a pretty chorus girl. Only he finds to his dismay, that the chorus girl has her own ideas as to how the supper should be conducted, and by the time he has persuaded her to fall in with his own ideas, she has also fallen in love with him. This is completely contrary to all protocol—the Royal Family of Carpathia abhor love and consider it entirely unnecessary for the efficient conduct of their affairs. The Regent thinks that he is about to get rid of the chorus girl, when his wife decides the chorus girl must accompany her to the Coronation as Lady-in-Waiting; then, when that has been accomplished and the Regent again thinks he is going to be rid of the girl, his son, the King of Carpathia, asks the chorus girl to go with him to an official ball that night.
