Lillian Hellman is known for her creations of character studies. In writing "Autumn Garden," she has allowed no exceptions to that rule. Each of her people play an equally important role in the show. Our cast describes the show as a "sort of a group therapy thing."

As they summer at a Gulf resort, we invite you to peer into the lives of:

"Rose Griggs," played by **MAGGIE JONES**. No introduction is needed here for those of you who have seen any number of shows. This is Maggie's role number ?? She doesn't remember how many she's done. I doubt that she remembers how many shows she has directed, assisted the director, worked on costumes, or some other capacity. She has served on committees, chaired committees and spent countless hours for the TLT. She also comes to the theatre each day, even in summer to feed Charlie, a cat who adopted us about two or three years ago.

"General Griggs," played by **BOB SCHMID**, who in reality is a teacher for the Tacoma School District. Bob appeared in shows twenty years ago, but left for a while. He did shows at Lakewood during that interval and upon his return last year played in "Rainmaker" and "Daughter of Silence."

"Mary Ellis," played by **KAY BUTLER**. This is Kay's first show away from Christmas Cantatas and the like. She teaches in the Peninsula School District and was brought here by Louis Talcott to try out. Thanks, Louie, and welcome, Kay.

"Frederick Ellis," played by **DOUG KLIPPERT**, another theatre nut. Matter of fact, he's a nut regardless of how you view him. Doug toured Europe a couple years ago on motor scooter, on foot, on thumb, and on 50c a day. He is just back from Spokane where he was program director for a popular radio station. He has worked backstage in most areas but appeared in "Raisin in the Sun" at Town and Gown and did three roles in "Anything Goes."

"Edward Crossman," played by **ERICK PETERSON**. Erick has appeared in at least two TLT shows. He has also shown himself at Lakewood and directed at Olympia. Erick and his wife (also involved in theatre) operate the Snelling & Snelling Employment Agency at 9th and Tacoma Ave., FU 3-1783.

"Sophie," played by **CHARLENE THOMPSON**. Unmarried, over 21, under 25, Charlene works at the Bon on The Mall. She spent two years at Clark Junior College.

"Constance Tuckerman," played by **BILLIE KENNEDY**. TLT has many good troopers, and one of them is BILLIE KENNEDY. Barbara Simpson, who was assigned the role of "Constance" became ill, and Billie "stepped in" a few days before the show opened, and is doing the role. You'll enjoy her work. Also, she's a member of the TLT Board of Directors and the Clef Dwellers.

"Nicholas Denery," played by **ROBERT RINER**. Bob played "Bob" in "Mary, Mary" last year. He also appeared in "Far Country." Bob is also a teacher, but he is in the Edgemont School District. He directed the children's theatre at Fircrest last year and serves on the board for that group.

"Nina Denery," played by **BARBARA WEBBER**. Here is another teacher. She's with the Clover Park District. She is married and has two children. Until now, Barbara says her only appearance at TLT was in the audience. She tried out for this show on impulse. Have another impulse soon, Babs.
