DOROTHY CLARK (Celia Pilgrim) likes the part of Celia whom she describes as a writer, intellectual but realistic. Dorothy has been very helpful in many ways at TLT. She has an undoubted flair for comedy, which she successfully demonstrated in the part of Dolly in "Annie Get Your Gun." She also played Mrs. Basset in "Summer and Smoke." Dorothy has many varied talents which keep her life interesting. She and Jeanne Olds have perfected a comedy-dance act with which they have delighted many groups. In private life, Dorothy is now working at being a perfect mother-in-law to her daughter's new husband.

DUNCAN MacLEAN (Andrew Pilgrim) is a seasoned thespian. He has a real cosmopolitan background, having played in theatre at Laguna, La Jolla, Jacksonville, Atlanta and Mexico City. Since coming to Tacoma he has done "Rainmaker" and "Dear Charles" for TLT and several plays at Lakewood. Duncan has many interests, among others, elk and moose hunting, for which he treks up to Canada. He loves the theatre and is very helpful backstage where he says he will do "anything." Duncan owns and operates the "Pampered Pet" in Highland Hills. When he gets a little fed-up with poodles he can always go after a moose.

JULIE MARSHALL (Marian Jellicoe) has enhanced the prestige of TLT for some time by taking parts in various plays, beginning, away back when, in "Kismet." She has also been active in many ways around the theatre, serving on the Board of Directors this year as Check Room Chairman. In addition to her home duties, she works as a legal secretary. Julie is also secretary of the Tacoma Writers' Club where she recently received honorable mention for poetry and an article on Scuba Diving, of which she and her husband are

devotees. With the excellence of her different portrayals, we think that Julie might join several other "Julies" who have achieved fame in the theatre world.

CANDY HINKS (Joanna Pilgrim). This charming girl graduated from Curtis in 1965. She loves doing musicals and while at Curtis, played the parts of Dorothy in the "Wizard of Oz" and Kim in "Bye-Bye Birdie." This last summer she delighted audiences at CDS productions, as Lesil in "The Sound of Music," and as Nancy Twinkle in "Little Mary Sunshine." After high school, Candy enrolled at the Tacoma Vocational School and took first prize in a talent show there last March. She now works as a legal secretary for Davies, Pearson, Anderson, Peterson and Gadbow. This is Candy's first appearance at TLT and we hope to see her here again soon.

ARTHUR FRONEY (Otis Clifton). Arthur works in the personnel department of Weyerhaeuser. He has been in several plays here, namely: "The Third Best Sport," "Operation Mad Ball" and "Showboat." He has served on the Play Selection Committee and the Executive Board of Tacoma Little Theatre. After an absence of three years, we welcome him back to do the part of Otis Clifton. In reading over the description of this character, Art was amazed to discover that his and Otis's descriptions were practically identical, to wit: Bachelor, age 35, wears glasses, carries a brief case. Coincidental? Some of Art's interests are enjoyment of music, golf and oil painting. One of his paintings was exhibited in a TLT foyer art display. Very good, too.
