## "WHO'S WHO"

SENATOR BOB MUNSON is played by KEN ZABRISKIE. Ken has done several shows with his wife at the Country Playhouse in Houston. Tonight, his wife, Lee, portrays CLAIRE MUNSON. The Zabriskies' have four children. Ken works for Pioneer Business Forms. Last year Lee aided Thor Neilson during his quick return to Tacoma at the Lakewood Arts Festival. One of this theatre couple's favorite shows is "Night of the Iguana".

SENATOR BRIG ANDERSON is played by JEFFREY ALDEN. Jeff is a spanking new USAF Captain. This is his first role for any little theatre. He has worked lights and makeup for various shows. He'd like to work our light board sometime. Jeff is married to a young gal named 'Lynn' who, tonight, will appear as MABEL ANDERSON, the young Senator's wife. Lynn's favorite role to date was in a one act entitled "The Bespectacled Prostitute".

SENATOR RICHARDSON is played by TOM MARR. Tom is a recent high school grad. He did "Gypsy" at Olympia last year. He plans to attend PLU.

SENATOR ORRIN KNOX is played by RAY WIESS. Ray is an old 'pro'. He has performed on New York stages, done road shows, television, etc. He recently retired from the army and he now pursues his next conquest — That: golf ball.

VICE PRESIDENT HUDSON is played by WALLY SIBBERT. Wally did "For Better for Worse" at TLT and "My Three Angels" for Fircrest. He is a teacher at Edgemont Junior High where he also coaches some of the sports activities.

SENATOR VANACKERMAN is played by DICK SONNTAG. Dick is on loan to us from the Bon Marche where he is "colored television salesman" (at good prices). —I bought one, anyway. He was Delta Phi Omega at college and won a spot on the national rating of "Best Thespian Honor Roll" in high school.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES. Although unnamed, this character will remind you of two or three chief execs. TLT's interpretation comes out well through PAT STEELE who needs no introduction to old-time theatre goers. He is a former City Councilman of Tacoma and has also had other political experiences. I first met Pat in '58 when TLT did "No Time for Sergeants". It's always a pleasure to see him on the stage.

SENATOR SEAB COOLEY is played by BOB SCHMID, a 'Dickie' winner, an old theatre participant, a fine actor, an enjoyable person both on and off stage. Bob is a teacher at the Tacoma Vocational School.

HERBERT GELMAN is played by JOHN CLAPP; who, at Lakewood Players, has done "Tender Trap" and "Visit to a Small Planet". He and his wife have two children. He was educated at Duke University, majoring in history and finished at the University of Minnesota. He is now a systems designer for Weyerhaeuser.

SENATOR CALLOWAY is played by DON R. SMITH. Don is an assistant prosecutor for Pierce County. He is active in local politics, being president of a Sixth District Club of one of the two major parties and recently ran for State Representative. It seems that Don spends most of his spare time at TLT. He has worked backstage on most everything, including stage manager.

SENATOR AUGUST is played by FRANK KURRIGER, who did several shows with the Community Players in Muscatine, Iowa. This is his first show at TLT. He has probably been too busy studying at St. Ambrose, being married, raising four kids and teaching math at Mt. Tacoma High School to do any shows. Glad you found the time now, Frank—stick around!

WILLIAM HUNTINGTON is played by SHELDON WALTER. Shel has done many shows at TLT; also at Boeing, where he works, and Ft. Lewis. Until a couple of years ago, he just 'showed up' for musicals. Then he started reading for other roles. It is a good transition and we always enjoy seeing Shelly in a show.

A show, such as ADVISE AND CONSENT, is a difficult one to play. It requires intense concentration and many hours work, as do most shows. Some people discover that they cannot find enough time, and they 'bow out'. So during rehearsals, members of the cast do change from time to time and it is not possible to include the new people or make late changes in the "Who's Who". Other members of the cast work just as hard on roles as do the 'leads'. Some of the people are PAT CONLEY, DON SHANDROW, and DOROTHY KEENAN.

All the cast and crew sincerely want you to enjoy the show, so sit back in your seat as long as you can and watch Washington shake in front of you.
