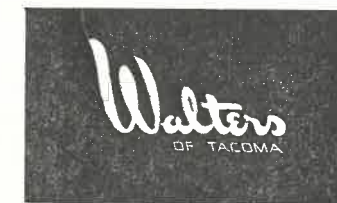

## "WHO'S WHO"

By Dorothy Clark

**JULIE MARSHALL (Emily Blachman)** — Besides her obvious handsome appearance and versatile adaptability on stage, Julie brings to our theatre an impressive list of abilities. She is an accomplished writer who has published both poetry and prose, has done some painting, redecorates her own home, works as a legal secretary, and in her spare time skin dives, enjoys boating and raises children. Julie has an interesting, gentle, offbeat philosophy of living that makes conversation with her a delightful experience.

**PAT COLLIER (Jim Blachman)** — The Tacoma School District employs Pat as a Systems Analyst, but around the theatre he is recognized as the able actor who has done both comedy and drama for our audiences. Before he came to Tacoma, he directed several plays for the Snohomish County Community Theatre.

**EDNA AND ERICK PETERSON (Mrs. Lawson and Clem)** — There is an aura of sincere warmth and friendliness that comes to the theatre with Edna and Erick. They tell hilarious and romantic stories about their courtship that started on a tennis court in a YMCA camp in Pennsylvania, and she insists that by adroit direction she maneuvered him into saying "I Do" in the first hour of their acquaintance. They own and manage an employment agency by day, have worked together at TLT since coming

to Tacoma in 1963—this summer have been building a waterfront retreat on Hood Canal.

**BARBARA SIMPSON (Sally Lynch)** — Her "Dickie" awarded to her for the best performance by an actress last year, is enthusiastically and lovingly cared for by her family, all of whom applaud Barb's efforts on stage. There is a pixie quality to her sense of humor, she is one with great sensitivity to the pulse of humanity, a characteristic that makes her particularly appealing and enjoyable to us all.

**MARGARET ZAFERIN (Miss Gilley)** — Guess you've seen Margaret many times in musicals here. She started 'way back when' in "Good News", has lately switched to roles in plays and stage managing. Her days are spent in the finance office at Madigan Hospital, she sings in and has directed her church choir, plays the piano—Margaret does a good job for us.

**MARIAN PLAQUET (Milly Moon)** — A great favorite among casts and audiences, Marian has fractured us all with her uninhabited and uproarious comedy interpretation. It takes a while to recover from seeing her in a show. Do you remember her as Mrs. Shinn in "Music Man?" Marian is a singer—is currently toying with the idea of learning to play the cello. Laugh with her, she's lots of fun.

**HANS KASK (Mr. Robinson)** — An engaging and energetic newcomer to TLT, Hans and his wife were born in Estonia and came to America 18 years ago. He attended St. Martin's college, Purdue University and the University of Washington, has a Master's Degree in civil engineering and is expecting his Washington State Engineers license any day. His wife teaches at Sheridan School, and this summer is enjoying their 18 month old daughter. I hope you find Hans as charming as I.

**CARY MASON AND BRUCE HOERAUF (Carlos and Jeffry)** — College bound high school buddies interested in drama as a hobby, Cary and Bruce are a pretty groovey pair. Cary was born in Japan, lived for awhile in Germany, has danced, sung and acted, says he was always cast "by accident." He expresses great interest in "Bohemian philosophy." Bruce thinks there's a great gap between the concept of young people generally accepted by adults

and promoted by the communications media. These seem to be perceptive, thoughtful, sincere young fellows.
