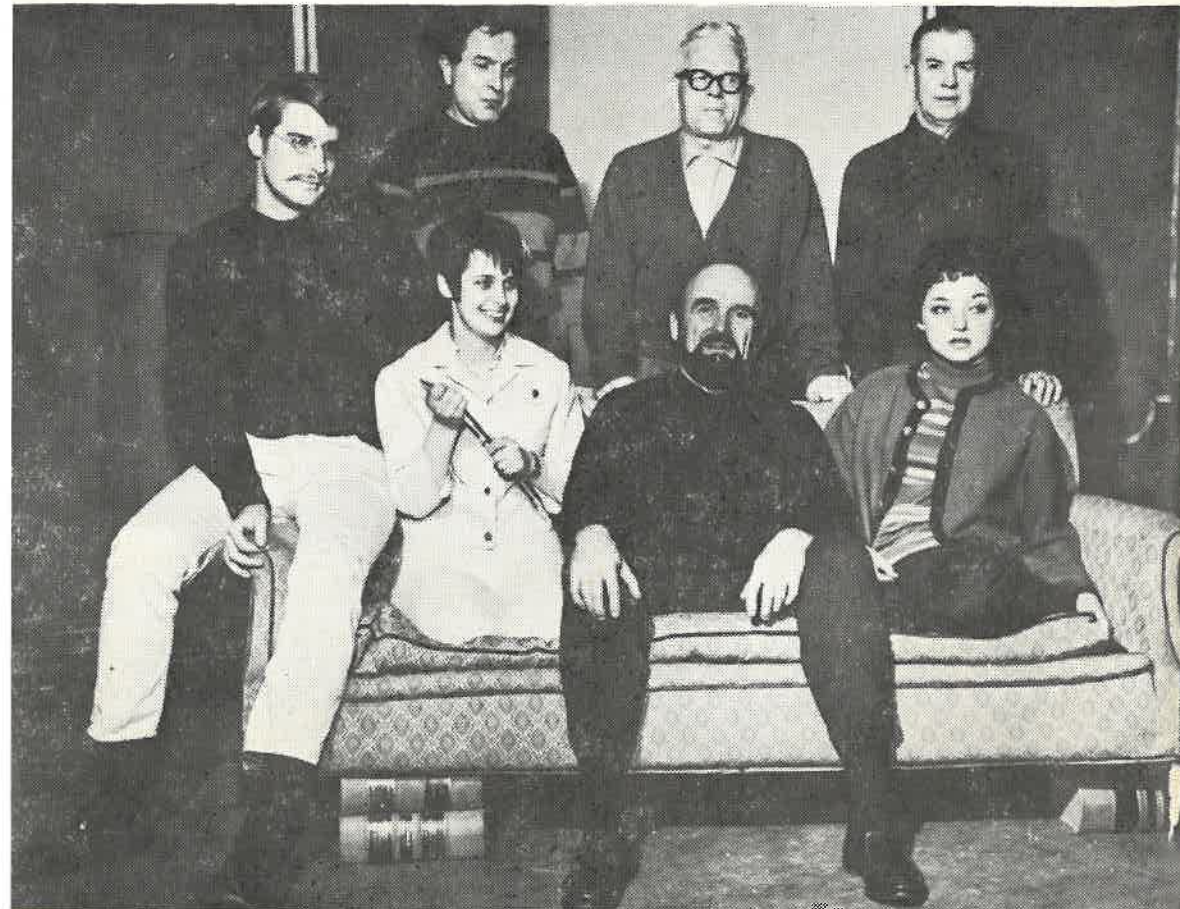

"WHO'S WHO"

EVE REYNOLDS (Director)—Eve is one of the most outstanding Community Theatre directors in the Northwest. With her numerous backlog of productions and stage appearances she brings with her the vitality and detailed directing which goes to make an excellent production. Her most recent success was "Lion in Winter" at the Lakewood Players. TLT remembers her for directing "Strange Bedfellows." Eve, who works for the TNT, is also Executive Director for the Lakewood Players and also directs the Arts for Youth. Assistant director on this production is Michael Wurl and assistants to the directors are Kathi Smith and Dick Monahan.

SAWYER GILLMER (Billie Dawn)—This is Sawyer's first appearance at TLT. Her previous stage experience has been at the Lakewood Players in "Stop the World I want to get Off," and the "Crucible" at the Snohomish County Community Theatre. At present, she is attending TCC where she is majoring in drama. Sawyer, a native of Tacoma, has 2 children to keep her busy as well as being stake Drama Director of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

DUNCAN MacLEAN (Harry Brock)—Duncan, who is quite familiar to Northwest theatre goers, recently completed a successful run in "Come Live With Me" at the Lakewood Players. He also was seen in "Angel Street" and "Lion in Winter." Duncan is very active in the theatre and TLT remembers him well for his last appearance 2 years ago in "Absence of a Cello."

JIM REYNOLDS (Eddie Brock)—Jim (no relation to the director) recently appeared in the Lakewood Players very successful hit "Come Live With Me." He also directed the play, "Thirteen Clocks" at LP and has been seen in such plays as "The Miser," "Man for All Seasons," and "Taming of the Shrew." Jim, who is in the advertising business, was last seen on the TLT stage in 1943.

FORREST GOLDADE (Paul Verall)—Forrest is also making his first appearance at TLT this season. He is not new to the stage though, since he participated in "Dark Lady of the Sonnets" and "Midsummer's Night Dream" while attending WWSC. Forrest, an artist at heart, is now attending Radio and TV Broadcasting at Tacoma Vocational-Technical Institute.

BOB SCHMID (Ed Devery)—You last saw Bob at TLT in "Advice and Consent." He has been quite active in the Lakewood Players both as actor and director. He directed "Hole in the Head" and was seen in "The Adding Machine." Bob, a veteran actor, has 3 boys and teaches at the Tacoma Vocational-Technical Institute.

MARY JEAN FINNEGAN (Mrs. Hedges)—Mary Jean has a long list of stage appearances both at TLT and LP. She has appeared in such productions as "Othello," "Breath of Spring," and "A View from the Bridge." Mary Jean works for the National Bank of Washington which goes hand in hand with being treasurer of the Lakewood Players.

KENNETH GOULD (Senator Norval Hedges)—Ken is not new to TLT. You may remember him in "Summer and Smoke" and "For Better—For Worse." Ken, who has worked for Hunt-Mottet Co. for 23 years, has also been quite active in his Church's 'Dramateers' where he has played the part of Judas.

VALARI SKALA (Helen)—Valari is a 1968 Lakes High graduate where she was very active in drama. Presently, she is attending TCC and was seen in the production, "A Case of Libel." She is also technical production assistant at TCC. Even though Valari is a busy college student she has found time to participate in her first Community Theatre production here at TLT.

JUDY BALL (A Manicurist)—Even though this is Judy's first stage appearance, she has been active behind the scenes at the Lakewood Players as well as TCC where she is presently a student. At TCC she was property manager for "A Thousand Clowns" and is a member of the Acting Club.

JERRY SANDSTEDT (Barber, Waiter, Assistant Manager and Bellhop)—As you will notice, Jerry is quite versatile in his first appearance at TLT. He will appear on stage in four different roles. Jerry is a student at TCC and has been quite active behind the scenes at Lakewood Players.
