"WHO'S WHO"

Welcome to tonight's play, and the inside glimpse of the schemes, plans and surprises leading up to the Jordan's formal Dinner at Eight.

Playing the hostess MILLICENT JORDAN is Dorothy Clark, properties chairman for Tacoma Little Theatre, a loyal backstage worker and often a most enjoyable actress. Remember the starched nurse in "Man Who Came to Dinner?" Dorothy's current hobby is writing poetry which she then recites in a one woman show for local groups. Last year she had poetry published in three different magazines. Her husband George is working backstage helping with lights (where he is an expert.)

DORA the maid in the Jordan household is played by Beth Waers, who is making her stage debut in this show. Beth is a former student of TLT Jr. Theatre classes which she attended while in Jr. high school. Formerly at Tacoma Community College, she now works at Peoples store. Too bad the script doesn't call for a pianist as she has had 14 years instruction.

GUSTAVE, who will be serving dinner, is played by Dale Westgaard. Dale appeared in "Mr. Roberts" and "MWCTD" here this season, and directed a local children's play. He attended Central and is currently working in the child study center at Western State Hospital.

Hosting the dinner is OLIVER JORDAN portrayed by Bob Evans, a TLT veteran, who is appearing in his eleventh show, and completing his fortieth year of association with the theatre. He has worked in all capacities at the theatre and taught the junior theatre classes. Bob who is a retired teacher (Stadium) says when he was 40 he played men of 60 and today he is playing a man near 40.

PAULA JORDAN, the daughter of the home is Donna Freestone a newcomer to our stage who was an active member of the Drama Club at Puyallup High. She is currently enrolled in the Tacoma Vocational School radio, TV and Broadcasting department. Riding and swimming are her hobbies.

RICCI, the Jordan Chauffeur, is Tad Faherty, whose previous stage experience was backstage at Bellarmine. He is also enrolled in the Radio-TV department at Tacoma Vocational. His hobby of photography has kept him busy snapping candid shots of the cast and crew.

Bev Williams, a TLT veteran, is playing the sister of the hostess, HATTIE LOOMIS, and she claims she was type cast in this part, as some of Hattie's traits are similar to her own! Bev has appeared in "Warm Peninsula" and "Love From a Stranger" at TLT as well as at Lakewood Players and Fircrest. She is currently working as a volunteer in the Hilltop area, teaching music, a hobby about which she is most enthusiastic.

MISS COPELAND, Oliver Jordan's secretary, brings Mary Kelley, a faithful backstage worker out in front tonight for her first stage appearance. She will be working properties on the show while her husband John is also working backstage.

Edna Peterson, a Dickie Award winner for outstanding work as an actress in "Lullaby" at TLT, is playing CARLOTTA VANCE and enjoying it immensely. Carlotta is the one who drops a bombshell with every sentence and never knows it! Edna is Decor Chairman for TLT, has been in many shows here as well as Lakewood, Olympia and Philadelphia where she formerly lived. Appearing in the third act with Edna is "Toyama" her own pet poodle, the only member of the cast who can claim an understudy! Edna is currently looking forward to a trip to Florida in April on Snelling and Snelling business, she and husband, Eric, own the local agency.

DON PACKARD, the big business man who is willing to do a little social climbing and attend the Jordan dinner, is played by Pat Collier, who has been seen on this stage many times in the past. Pat has also directed several plays in the Everett area where he formerly lived.

Tammy Anderson is on stage as KITTY PACKARD, who is looking forward to the dinner as her first chance to break into society. Tammy says she cannot recall the number of shows she has appeared in at TLT, starting with "Send Me No Flowers." She has also worked with Lakewood Players and currently is employed by the Bank of Washington Travel Center.

TINA, Kitty's maid, is played by Dorlean Wall, who was the snake charmer in "Carnival," but is better known at TLT for her excellent work on costumes and properties.

Jack Willing portrays DR. TALBOTT, making his first stage appearance. An enthusiastic golfer, Jack was transferred here from Vancouver, Wash. by Globe Ticket Company where he is Sales Manager. Jack is a recent bridegroom.

LARRY RENAULT, the aging actor and boyfriend of Paula Jordan, is played by Harry Groom. He is making his first Tacoma appearance but has acted in or directed some half dozen shows while living in Anchorage and Fairbanks. Previously in radio and teaching, Harry is now an editor in Weyerhaeuser publications. Harry has also done freelance photography in Alaska.

Mike Mullins plays the BELLBOY at Renault's hotel. He has played several comedy roles in Shakespeare and musical comedy in the east.

Jim Thorpe plays Renault's agent MAX KANE. Taking his first part with a little theatre group, Jim attended Jr. college in the Tri Cities area. He has been in Tacoma about three years.

Dr. Talbott's office Nurse MISS ALDEN is played by Gale Obert. Gale points out the coincidence that her first contact with TLT was as a student of Bob Evans in Jr. Theatre and tonight she has one of her main scenes with him. A former student at Washington State U., Gale has two children and a architectural engineer husband.

LUCY TALBOTT, who is looking forward to the Jordan Dinner is played by Georgette Hansen whose previous experience has been in her home town of Detroit. This Wayne State U. graduate has been in Tacoma one year and claims music is her first hobby.

Alida Evans, plays MRS. WENDEL the Jordan cook, and her husband Bob says this is the third play they have appeared in together. Bob also says she is an excellent cook. Days, Alida is Executive Secretary for the Tacoma Real Estate Board.

Charlie Vawter, who makes all the front theatre signs for TLT is playing JOE STENGEL the producer. Charlie is an enthusiastic backstage worker and has appeared in shows here over the past years and has always turned in excellent performances. Remember that Palm Tree Loving captain in Mr. Roberts?

ED LOOMIS, the reluctant guest at the Jordan Dinner, is played by Darrell Darnell, past president of TLT and Dickie Award winner for outstanding service to the theatre. Darrell and his wife Ethlyn were top ticket sellers in 1968 and both serve on the board of TLT.

Also in the cast are: MR. FITCH, hotel manager, played by Louis Talcott; BELLBOY played by Mike Mullins.
