"WHO'S WHO"

LARRY BOAG (Geoffery Hammond and Chung Li)

This is Larry's first TLT appearance, but if he isn't a professional now he has been, and may be again in the future, although when asked about it, he said that he expects to keep theatre as a hobby. He is now Assistant Display Manager at Sears. He was in professional stock in 1958, and in 1961 toured with the Virginia City Players of Montana. One Harmon Brown, of the University of Montana, suggested that he attend the University, which he did, as a drama major, for 3 years, during a part of which he held an Assistantship in Technical Theatre.

While at the University he had parts in "Street Scene," "Anything Goes," and was a technician in "The Bat," "Charlie's Aunt" and others. He was in the cast of "The Fantastics," which later toured the Orient as a USO Show, but at that time Larry was in the Air Force, but saw other USO shows with famous actors. While in Euphrata he directed a children's show for the community.

HERMIONE ANDERSON (Mrs. Leslie Crosbie)

'Hermie', as she is known, is a native of Tacoma and a Drama Major at U. of W. Her daughter has just graduated from U. of W., with the same degree. Her daughter has just been given the lead role in a U. of W. musical.

She played various TLT roles before the family moved to Texas, returning 4 years ago. Since returning, Hermie has been in TLT productions each year. The first was "Summer and Smoke," then 'Lulu' in "Love from a Stranger" (she got a Dickie for this one), and then as the aging star in "Warm Peninsula" (another Dickie); then she also played in "The Music Man." Her present role is her first in a straight part, she says, the others having been all of rather zany characters. At present she is librarian at St. Josephs.

MIKE PARKER (Headboy)

Mike is a native Tacoman, and a senior at Stadium Hi. His career at TLT began with "Mr. Roberts." He had come to rehearsal with Gary Coyne, and was shanghied by the Director who needed crew members. Now, he has already tried out for a part in the next one. Mike is one of five children — sons and daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Parker. TLT is his only hobby at present because of a heavy work load as a high school senior.

HANS KASK (John Withers)

This is Hans' second appearance at TLT. Also played in "Chicken Every Sunday." He is a professional Engineer with A.B.A.M. Engineers. He trained at the U. of W., St. Martin's, from which he obtained his B.S., and Purdue where he took his Masters Degree. He designs bridges and buildings; for example, Rhodes Sky Bridge, which he designed and on which he supervised construction.

A native of Estonia, Hans came to Tacoma in 1963. He is married. Mrs. Kask teaches at Grant Elementary. They have a little daughter. He is volleyball coach at the YMCA—and was an All Star—Northwest District. He sings in the choir at Central Lutheran. He is also Secretary of the Tacoma Engineers.

"WHO'S WHO" (Continued)

DICK SONNTAG (Robert Crosbie)

Here's a coming professional—if he isn't one already. Aiming for the TV and Radio World, he is studying for a degree in Theatre Arts. That is, he is studying from time to time, as he is a Membership Representative in the Tacoma office of AAA.

You'll probably remember him in "Advise and Consent." Some years ago he was in "A Doll's House" at PLU. While an undergraduate at Olympic College, he was elected to Delta Psi Omega Honor Society; and earlier at Stadium High was on the National Thespian Honor Roll, along with only 249 other students in the United States.

In what moments he has, is active in politics (of course, when he's Jack Sonntag's son) serving as Vice President for the Sixth Congressional District Young Democrats and now serving on the campaign for John J. O'Connell.

DR. LON HOOVER (Howard Joyce)

Here's a TLT Board member who is not content just to be on the Board—he has taken a turn at about everything around the theatre — and look at the list of acting parts: "Desert Song," "Anything Goes," "Annie Get Your Gun," "Operation Madball," "Inherit the Wind," "Point of No Return." He has appeared in plays for the Lakewood Players, the Thor Neilson Players, in an emergency, and went on the stage with no rehearsal.

Other interests are skiing, mountain climbing. He's been up Mt. Rainier 5 times; Mt. Baker 7 times, and has climbed all the major peaks in the northwest, and a few in California. And as for organizations aside from TLT, he belongs to Rotary, World Affairs Council (he's President), Mountain Rescue, Mountaineers, First Congregational Church (Supt. of Sunday School); Vice President of the Osteopathic Medical Ass'n. What time he has left belongs to the family: Mrs. Hoover and two daughters.

SEIJI KAMIMURA (Ong Chi Seng)

Seiji was born in Hawaii, on the Island of Maui. He came to the Northwest to attend the U. of W., having received the degree of "Building Technology and Administration." He is employed as a draftsman by A.B.A.M. Engineers, a firm in the concrete technology field. Pretty highbrow, what? Though he says he sometimes misses his old home, he loves the Northwest. He is single, and we hope he will locate a 'Mrs. Kamimura' right here on our shores.

MYRTLE MURRAY (Mrs. Parker)

Myrtle is sure that she is typed forever: this time, matron of the jail; in her other TLT role a housekeeper. She's musical. She has led children's choirs for some eleven years — presently one at the Summit Methodist Church.

She is a housewife and also the bookkeeper for Harmon Rentals. She has 3 children, 3 grandchildren. Her interests she says are "the goingest woman in Tacoma" — to see sports events, to hunt or to fish or what have you. She is currently singing with a ladies' barbershop quartet.

BEVERLY HAVERLY (Chinese Woman)

Bev is currently costume chairman, and in between times she does a spot of acting. How did she get started? By following the example of her son, Jon, who played in "The Sound of Music" and "Brigadoon." She belongs to a group of some 40 women who sing in barbershop quartets. She also knits, sews and does costume designing. She has just celebrated her 25th wedding anniversary. She has 4 children: 2 married, a daughter at the U. of W., and Jon of acting fame, as noted above.

AUDREY LOOMIS (Mrs. Joyce)

Although Audrey is now a housewife with a job at the Puget Sound Bank — and the mother of 4 children, some married and the youngest at the U. of W., she has also had a career as a singer, mostly in St. Paul. She has sung in "The Telephone," "La Boheme," "Manon," "Sweetheart," "New Moon," "Merry Widow" and many others. She met her husband when both were singing in 'The Chocolate Soldier,' and in 1941 she won the Metropolitan Audition of the Air. She is also an organist. Audrey says she is enjoying the change to drama, which she decided to take up for recreation.

And, finally, let's not forget the director, John Culbertson, the invisible man who none the less is to be seen in each production. He is reflected by each character in the way they speak and move about. He is reflected, also, in the scenery, having been observed taking a hand at pasting up walls, hammering nails, and one thing or another. The indispensable man, as well as visible invisible one.
