## "WHO'S WHO"

By Dorothy Clark

Tacoma Little Theatre wishes you a happy Holiday Season, and presents to you this special gift of laughter, wrapped in red and green, tied with a gold ribbon, festooned with mistletoe and holly; THE MAN WHO CAME TO DINNER, solves no problems, probes no psychological depths, is as familiar and comfortable as Christmas and just as full of joy.

Watch the stage closely tonight, lest you miss some of the delightful cameo characters who skitter in and out from time to time, each with his own particular contribution of nonsense.

First to appear is Mrs. Stanley, flighty flutterdejibbet who is in a constant state of consternation. This part is portrayed by ELIZABETH BENSON for the second time. Elizabeth enjoys all the creative arts . . . writes, paints, sings, grows orchids, is custodian for a home that has 12 aquariums, 4 children, a dog, a cat, a bird and a husband. (Not in that order).

If you blink your eyes you may miss Miss Preen, in starched uniform and cap spends most of her time being terrified and confused by her employer. DOROTHY CLARK, (that's me) does a lot of little things around TLT . . . likes props, and Who's Who, sings very badly but whenever she can, dances a little, writes pretty good poetry and hopes you will laugh loud and long at her portrayal of the Nurse.

Richard and June Stanley are played by DOUG DULMAGE, who was part of the crew of "Mr. Roberts", and KATHE HUSEBY, for whom this play is a first theatrical venture. JOSEPH GEISLER joins YVONNE DAUGHERTY, to bring to life the characters of John and Sarah, faithful servants to the Stanley family. Joe is a most enterprising newcomer who finds his way without too much instruction, and Yvonne entertains us with stories of her family that lives in a 12 room "mausoleum".

We are all happy to see BOB SPEIGHT back on TLT's stage. He is a versatile old timer who has done just about every job connected with theatre; directing, stage managing, acting, whatever Bob undertakes he does well. The role of Mr. Stanley, bombastic host to THE MAN is played tonight by Bob.

I first saw NANCY SELLIN competing for the spotlight with John Gayton in "Poor Richard" . . . and a bright and shining competitor she was. Nancy is a school marm, former member of the Peace Corps, and has recently been active in the West-gaard Players. Watch for Nance in a couple of years—she is taking singing lessons and will probably be doing a lead in a musical. Maggie is her role.

PAT O'LEARY has a most impressive list of acting credits to display. His approach to the character of Dr. Bradley is hilarious and we hope that the doctors in the audience will enjoy his antics as much as we have.

Sheridan Whiteside, the irascible scoundrel who weaves his own little web of deceit and nonsense and is eventually its victim, is AL CUMMINGS' contribution to our Christmas package. (Do you hear Al on KTNT early in the morning?) Al, who spends most of his time on stage in a wheel chair, manages to dominate the situation with gusto and energy. He came to us with his lines all learned . . . Sherry is a part he has played before.

And then there is CAROL HAZELRIGG, neophyte with no experience and no confidence (she says) who floats onto the stage, says nine nonsensical lines and steals the show. She is Harriet.

BUDDY KEITH (Bert Jefferson) collects books, rides bulls, lifts weights, sports a mighty karate chop, wears groovey checked pants and for all of that is a most personable and likeable chap. Bud is a professional entertainer who has worked with most of the top country music stars, travelling around the U.S. and the Orient. He is now attending UPS.

FRAN WAX (Lorraine Sheldon) brings beauty and sophistication to TLT. She appeared last December in "Any Wednesday", and was a contender for the Dickie Award for best actress of the year. Watching her, therefore, should be a special treat.

As Beverly Carlton, JERRY FOSTER, brings a debonair, continental flavor to his role. Jerry sort of grew up here at TLT, first appearing on our stage when he was in high school.

DAVE ISAACSON (Banjo) just about fractures us all with his comedy. About once a year he ventures forth on our stage and does something to a part that no one else has ever done. Dave is responsible for much of the art work on the set.

DALE WESTGAARD (Sandy) this fall produced and directed his own play, "The Unwealthy King" for Tacoma's children. He wrote the delightful musical accompaniment, designed and constructed the sets. He is a most talented young man.

There are a number of others appearing in small parts in the show. Linda Wilson, Ruth Schilling, Doug Klippert, Michael Hart, Stan Veitenheimer, Mike Parker, Carl Farlow, Ron Parton, Gene Bigornia.

It takes special dedication and interest to contribute to the atmosphere and mood of a show by doing a walk-on part. The rest of the cast salutes these participants and expresses its appreciation to them.

Christmas is a precious time. Hold it gently and joyously to your heart.
