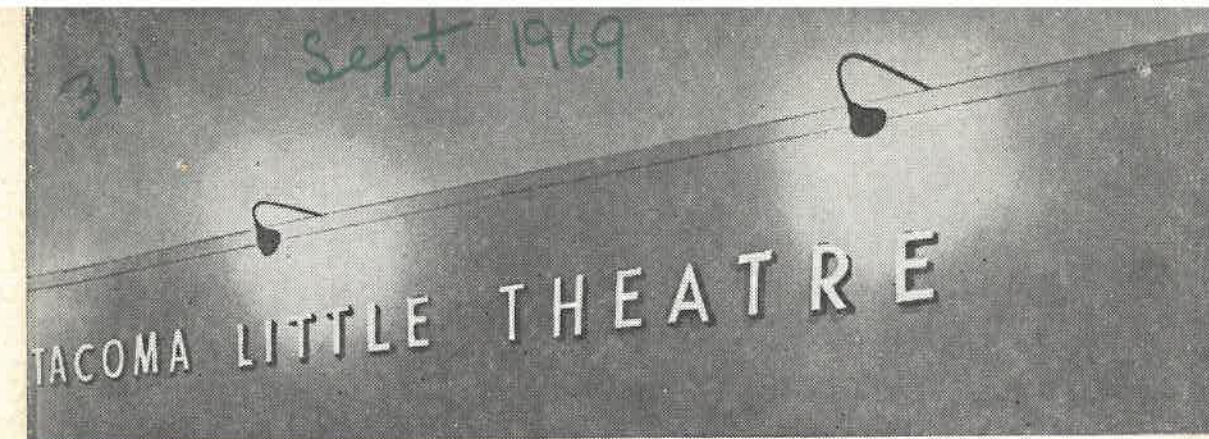

"WHO'S WHO"

Welcome to the second half of TLT's first hundred years. This is our 51st consecutive season. If you attended the banquet at the end of last season, you met the new Director, Doyle R. Smith. Doyle attended Drake U's School of Fine Arts and received his MFA from U. of Texas. He spent seven years in Europe, working as an Entertainment Director, Army Special Services. He also had two years off Broadway. Worked on a Doctorate in Music Theatre at U. of Oregon, and sings tenor.

Tonight's talent is a mixture of new and old faces, seasoned and green actors. The players are:

JACK RICHARDSON as OSCAR: Jack has done 12 of the 16 musicals TLT has produced. He also appeared in 3 comedies and dramas for TLT. You may have seen him in shows for other amateur groups and may see him each weekend at Steve's Gay Nineties where he MC's. He works for the Attorney General's office in the Highway Dept. For years, Jack has been active in volunteer youth work in the area and is now President of the Deslyn Boy's Ranch.

ARNOLD HANSEN as FELIX: Arnie describes himself as a nervous bridge player. He's been in Tacoma for a year and a half and works for the U.S. Geological Survey.

LARRY ROBERTS as MURRAY: Larry has been in radio and TV for twenty years, is married and has five (5) count 'em, five children. He lives within walking distance of TLT and finally has talked himself into trying out for a role.

TOM DAVIDSON as SPEED: Tom works as a teacher for the Tacoma Schools at Whittier Elementary. Last year, he won a Dickie for best supporting actor for his role in "Mister Roberts".

JACK MCCLEARY as ROY: Jack also appeared in "Mister Roberts" last year and did "My Three Angels" for Fircrest. Jack is a lab head for two plants of Hercules Chemical Co.

DON MELVILLE as VINNIE: Don played Abe Lincoln in Tacoma's Centennial Celebration earlier this year. This is his first crack at amateur theatre.

ELEANOR (ELLIE) O'SHEA as GWENDOLYN: Ellie did "Music Man" and "Sound of Music" for TLT, appeared in both recent productions of the Tacoma Opera Society, and while in L.A., did productions for a group there.

EVE SCALICI as CECILY: Eve has lived in Tacoma for a year. She and her husband intend to stay here when he retires from the USAF. Originally from Deal, England, she speaks proper English and enjoys the dialects heard in her new country. She is married and has three children.

There are many people that you will not see on stage tonight, but all of whom made the show what it is. Space prevents even a simple description of their duties and activities, notwithstanding their time involved. The Assistant Director, Bill King; the Stage Manager, Elise Arnold; the light chairman, John Kelley; Sound Chairman, Doug Klippert; Properties, Mary Kelley; set construction, Phil Parker; and the Technical Director, Don Watt. They will not take curtain call, but they too serve.
