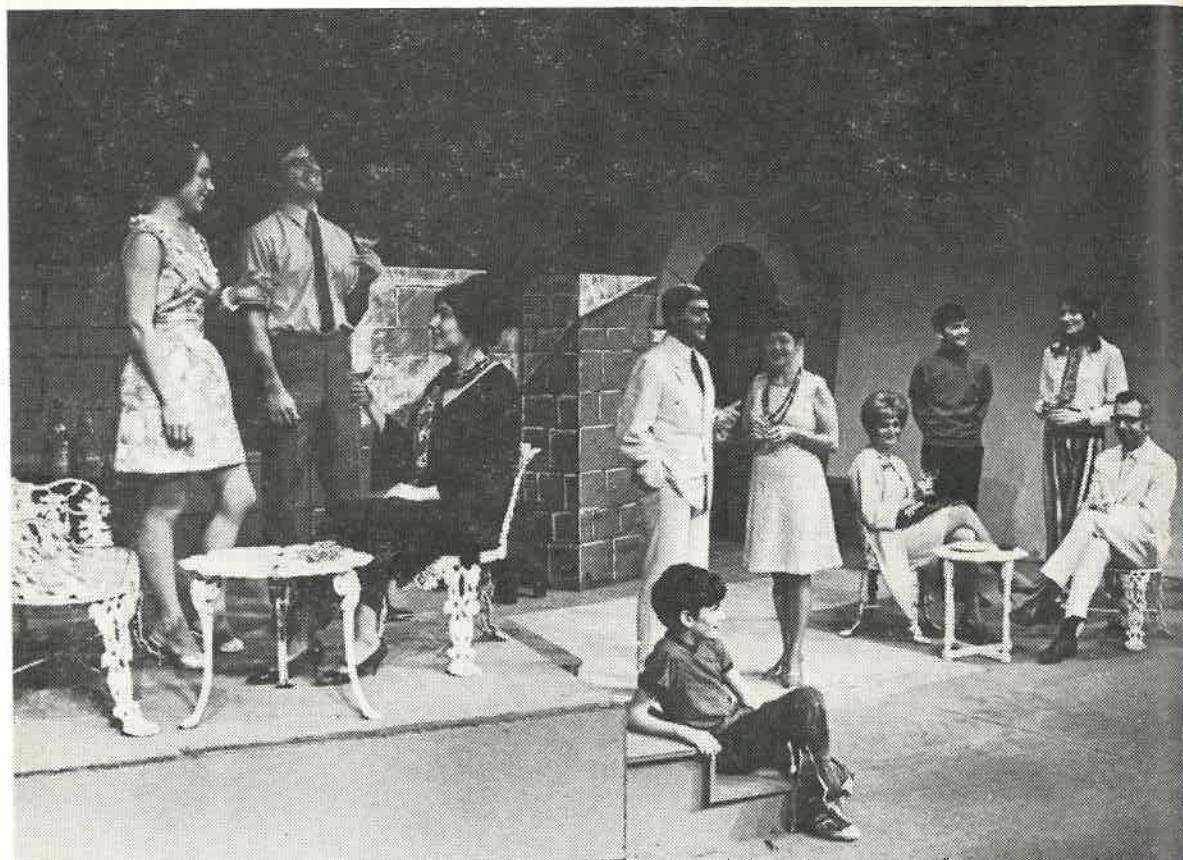

## SYNOPSIS OF PLAY

A gentle, perceptive comedy about an American secretary, quite a bit past her youth and still unmarried, who has earned herself a vacation in Europe, and finds herself in a pensione edging one of the canals of Venice. She is a warm, natural, forthright American woman with no complexes, who has a normal desire for affection. She finds it in Venice, in the person of a gallant middle-aged shopkeeper. Her American sense of the way life should be conducted is jolted when she discovers that this man who fascinates her is married, living with his wife and several children quite contentedly, and not afraid to admit these circumstances. Thus, the secretary comes to realize the difference between the American and the European view of morality, and the conflict that results in the crux of the play.

BEVERLY PFLUGMACHER (Giovanna) was influenced to try out for a part in this play by the invitation to do so which appeared in our local press. So here she is, her first time at TLT. She is a graduate of Washington State where she was active in school publications and various phases of the art program. She now is a teacher at Park Avenue Elementary School. Beverly likes sports and also dancing, bowling and travel.

BEV WILLIAMS (Leona Samish) the secretary, is no stranger to Tacoma Little Theater, having appeared in "Love From a Stranger," "Warm Peninsula," and "Dinner at Eight." Her husband, Herb, editor of a Weyerhaeuser Trade Publication, is going free-lance to do various types of outdoor themes in addition to industrial writing. now she is doing civic duty by teaching music and creative dramatics at Hilltop Community Day Care Center where her lucky pupils include youngsters from two to five years of age.

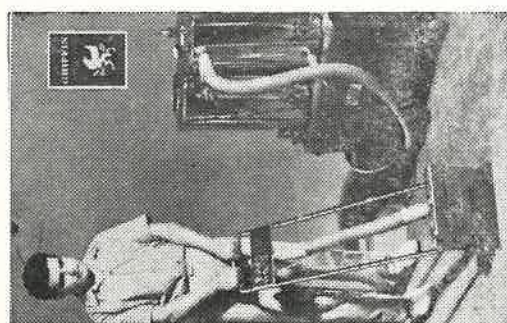

Jonn is a student at Hunt Junior High, is interested in sports and as for a future career, is trying to decide between Public Relations - Business Management or Professional Acting.

**Y. CHANCEY NIXON**, Assistant Director for this show, has been back in Tacoma only a few weeks, after spending twelve years in southern California actively engaged in Theater work.
