AL CUMMINGS (Edward)

Al is probably the most widely known individual ever to appear on the TLT stage. Besides hearing him daily on KTNT radio he can be seen on Channel 11 each weekday morning with his own interview show. Al's theatrical involvement extends throughout the United States. He has played at the Pocono Playhouse in Scranton, N.J., The Lethetremitne in Chicago and the Cirque in Seattle, to name a few. He has directed numerous plays and has taken on many leading roles such as Big Daddy in "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof", the husband in "Luv," and our last treat at TLT in "The Man Who Came to Dinner." Al is a great asset to the Community theatre both on stage and off since he is always promoting and plugging TLT through his media of radio and TV.

MAXINE PETERMAN (Veta)

Maxine is making a comeback to TLT. Her last performances were in the Old Town Theatre where she did "State of the Union," "The Women," and her favorite "The Torch Bearer." Last year she was seen in "The Rivals" at the Lakewood Players when she played the part of Mrs. Malaprop. In the past, she has directed and choreographed plays in Eugene, Portland and San Jose. Maxine is interested in the youth of today, especially getting them involved in theatre work.

LUCILLE BERRY (Ethel)

You wouldn't recognize Lucille from her last performance at TLT when she played the part of Nonno—the Old Man in "Nite of the Iguana." She has been in theatre work for many, many years. Lucille is a graduate of the Pasadena Playhouse, played the repertory theatre in L.A. She also played in the stage adaptation of "Dracula" at the Beaux Arts theatre in L.A. Lucille majored in drama at CPS (UPS) and is a member of Theta Alpha Phi the national honorary dramatic fraternity.

MIKE RIPKA (Wilson)

Mike really leads a busy life! His activities at TLT is considered his "relaxation." He has appeared at TLT in "Operation Madball," "Case of Libel" and "Suds in Your Eye," besides being chairman of the light committee. Mike is married and a student at UPS where he is in a pre-medical program getting ready to attend medical school at U. of California. He also analyzes jet fuels and gasolines for U.S. Oil. In his spare time (?) he likes to write, especially short stories.

PAUL HARWICK (Judge Gaffney)

This is Paul's first appearance at TLT. 20 years ago he acted the part of Wilson in "Harvey" at the Walla Walla Little Theatre. Paul is a graduate of USC and NYC. He has taught at the U. of W., NYC, Whitman, UPS and TCC. He has a son at the U. of W., and a daughter doing graduate work at San Francisco University. Paul is presently a chartered Life Underwriter and has the Life and Health Insurance Agency in Tacoma.

ARNOLD AND GEORGETTE HANSEN (Dr. and Mrs. Chumley)

Arnold and Georgette came to the Northwest 3 years ago from Detroit, Michigan. Both attended Wayne University where Georgette majored in drama and Arnold graduated in the field of Science. They have both been active at TLT the past two seasons. Arnold was seen in the "Odd Couple" and "The King and I." Georgette appeared in "Dinner at Eight." The Hansen's have two children and Arnold is employed with the U. S. Department of Interior as a hydrologist.

CHUCK KELLER (Dr. Sanderson)

Chuck is an import from the mid-west—Minnesota. He came to the northwest to attend St. Martin's College where he was quite active in musical and choral groups. We last saw him at TLT in "Suds in Your Eye." Chuck is married, has three children and is kept busy as sales manager for Globe Ticket Co.

KAREN HAVNAER (Myrtle)

Karen had been active in theatre work on 2 campuses before making her debut at TLT. She earned her B.A. at Pacific University and her education degree at UPS where she acted in "Fefers People," "Under Milkwood" and "School for Wives." Karen enjoys free lance writing and is presently substituting in the Tacoma Public Schools.

BEV PFLUGMACHER (Miss Kelly)

Bev was seen this season in "Case of Libel" and last season in "Time of the Cuckoo." She is a graduate of WSU and had done graduate work at Arizona State. Bev is a kindergarten teacher in the Tacoma Public Schools.

SUSIE HAZELRIGG (Inga)

Susie is the youngest member of the cast. She is a sophomore at Stadium High School where she is in a pre-college program. Susie has been in two musicals at TLT, "The King and I" and "The Sound of Music."

TOM BIRKELAND (Lofgren)

You may recall Tom before at TLT when he played Tommy in "Music Man." He also performed in "The Sound of Music" and "Thousand Clowns." Tom has attended Central Washington College where he did some play writing and one of his plays will be produced this spring at the college.

PAT CHAPMAN (Director)

Pat is a very familiar face at TLT and the number of shows he has appeared in are too numerous to list. Pat is one of those rare individuals who has completed the full circle at TLT. During his youth he attended the Junior theatre and from then on has been extensively involved at TLT as an actor, technician, committee chairman, board member and now as a director. Pat has also directed at the Lakewood Players and this spring will be directing at Green River Community College.

JERRY FOSTER (Assistant Director)

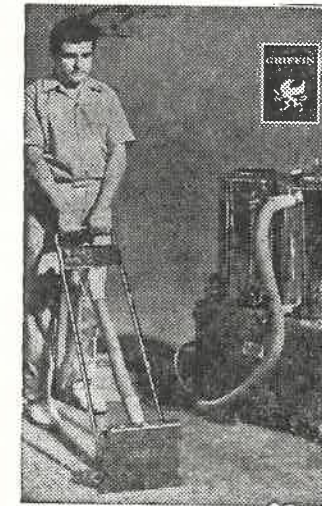
