

"WHO'S WHO"

EVE REYNOLDS is guest director for Love In E-Flat. She has plenty of experience in directing, too, both for TLT and the Lakewood Players, not to speak of years of interest in the theatre. You may recall she was the director for Born Yesterday, and Breath of Spring for TLT, and, if you are also a patron of the Lakewood Players, you will have seen her work in Lion in Winter, Luv and Look Homeward Angel. But of all the direction jobs she has had she is proudest, she says, of the Summer Stock and Rock Festival last year in Lakewood. She was not only the director, but she thought up the idea and produced it, too, as well as handling assorted other jobs. It was something new, it was more than well received especially by young people in the audiences, and it made a tidy sum for the coffers of the theatre which, along with other such community groups, were not overfilled with cash. Eve is a Tacoman and in her daylight hours is a reporter, who also sometimes writes reviews, for the Tacoma News-Tribune. And in her jauntings about, especially after dark, her four-footed companion is Shortie, a most agreeable terrier of uncertain, but obviously aristrocratic, ancestry.

JERRY SANDSTEDT (Howard) is a Tacoman and insists on describing himself in the following words: "I have no hobbies, family or money; I am a crabby person."

(!) Jerry is studying for a B.S. in fish and fowl hatchery management, gloomily predicting poorly paid government jobs. His experience in theatre work includes Summer Tree, The Rivals and A Taste of Honey—here he did production work rather than acting—Dirty Work at the Crossroads and the Stock and Rock Festival,—all for Lakewood Players. You have seen him in Born Yesterday here at TLT; the current play is thus his second one and we trust it will not be his last.

DOUG KLIPPERT (Mitch). Some ten years ago Doug came here from Lawton, Oklahoma, where he was a junior reporter on the Lawton News. He was even then interested in the theatre and played in Merry-Go-Round and Green Trees. His last few plays were Bus Stop for TLT, I Cant Hear You When the Water Is Running for Lakewood Players and Crucible for TCC. His daytime job is with the Western Farmer's Co-op. where he is an Agricultural Catalogue Appraiser. When ye reporter asked what in the world an Agricultural Catalogue Appraiser did, she found it was a position similar to that of Comparison Buyer except the fingers do the walking through catalogues of rival firms instead of the whole person going about shopping in enemy territory. Oh, yes, and for those interested: Doug is single.

MICHAAL WURL (Mr. Cooper). Love in E-Flat is a first at TLT for Michaal (yes, spelled with two "a's") who consented to step into the part of Mr. Cooper at the last moment. He is a TCC student of the theatre, especially directing which he expects to make his profession. Michaal came to Tacoma as a small boy when his father was transferred here by Weyerhaeuser Company. Recently the family was transferred out again but Michaal has remained, batching it and going to college. He has already had considerable directing experience mostly at the Lakewood Players; among his credits are: a melodrama and A Taste of Honey. Also he played Gene in Look Homeward Angel and Lucky in Waiting for Godot in the Lakewood Festival last summer. He will direct The Importance of Being Ernest for Lakewood this spring.

WHO'S WHO (Continued)

TERY MURPHY (Amy). Terry is a single gal from right here in Tacoma; she works at Cole and Weber, an advertising agency. Her real love is the theatre and this is her first play for TLT. She has a longer list of credits from the Lakewood Players, however, including Toys in the Attic, Look Homeward Angel and last summer's Stock and Rock Festival. Further back is Mourning Becomes Electra for the University of Washington where she studied three years. She says she may someday return to the Actors Training School, affiliated with the U. of W. Her hobbies? Theatre, of course, and right now TLT where most of her spare time is spent. Her director added two more credits: Come Live With Me and Dirty Work at the Crossroads, both from Lakewood; she also gives Jerry A+ for talent.

VALERIE JAMES (Bea). This is a first in the area for Valerie who came to Tacoma a couple of years ago from Yakima. She is such a busy girl that one wonders how she found time to take on TLT at all—but we can be glad she did. Valerie is a student with a major in Spanish; she intends to teach that language. She also tutors several Chinese in English, works part-time at the Trim Cleaners and teaches a Spanish class at McIlvaigh Junior High. She lists her hobbies as writing, reading, dancing, traveling and "anything that keeps me active, like sports." With nothing much left out, she should have an interesting time in life. Cheers for such enthusiasm!

RON SCHMITT (Stanley) once came to a rehearsal with Bob Evans whom many of you know. This was the beginning of an active career in TLT for Ron. He has appeared in many plays including such diverse ones as The Taming of the Shrew and Volpane (this one for Lakewood) and The Man Who Came to Dinner. He also has many musicals to his credit: Brigadoon, Carnival, and The Vagabond King for TLT, others for the Tacoma Opera Society. He is a former member of the TLT Board, having served as Lighting Chairman, and is currently a member of the Lakewood Players Board. Ron is married, has two really small boys—ages two and one—and works for White Front in the receiving department. He says he and his department comrades use the elegant, if unofficial, title of "Merchandising and Delivery Expeditors." Something, wot? Oh, and he likes "meller-drammer" as well as classics and has performed at Steve's on occasion. AND he has appeared in a genuine TV commercial!
