Sunday", and "Roman Candle". At the Lakewood Players they appeared together
in "Critic's Choice" and "Poor Richard", and at the Olympia Little Theatre in "Every-
body Loves Opal". The Peterson's are among those few that have won "Dicky Awards"
at TLT.

BEV WILLIAMS (Ada Westbrook)

For the past six years Bev has been doing both leads and supporting roles at TLT.
You will no doubt recall her portrayal as "Ivy" in last year's production of "Critic's
Choice". Last year she also played in "Thurber Carnival" at LP. Bev's main interests

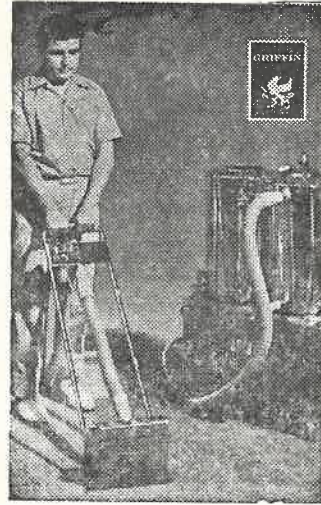
