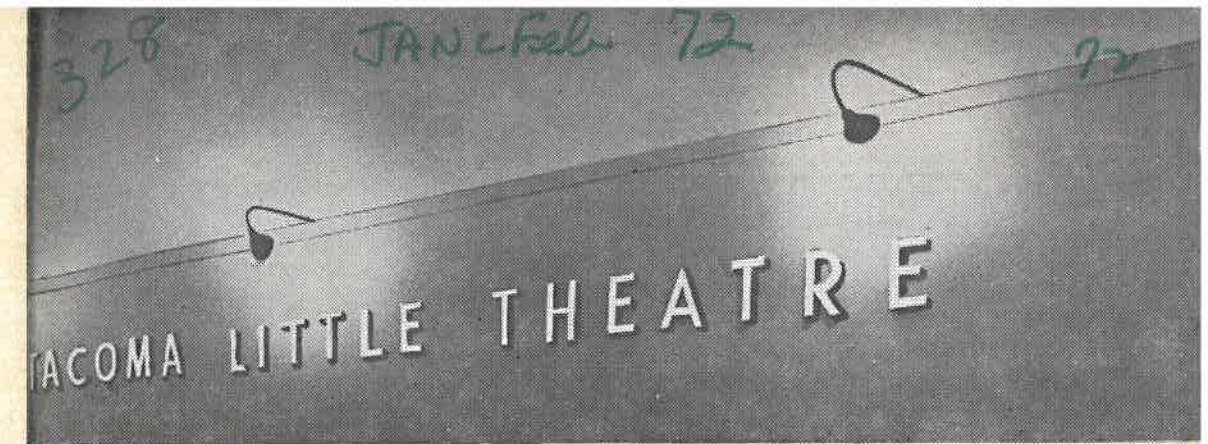

"WHO'S WHO"

By Dorothy Clark

An attic full of used furniture . . . a roomful of worn out memories . . . all the tangible assets of a human lifetime piled in the dusty corners of a collapsing building . . . they wait in desperate desolation for someone to give them a value and witness instead the bitter haggling of their human counterparts over their price. This is a sad and emotional play, brought to you tonight by four of TLT's most perceptive actors, John Culbertson, who also directed the play, Stan Veitenheimer, Robert Schmid, and Maggie Jones.

JOHN CULBERTSON creates the character of VICTOR FRANZ, drawing on his extensive experience on the stage in New York and with the Armed Forces entertainment division. John had worked in Shakespearean theatre in the east, directed his own theatre and was our resident director for five years. He now does all of the technical work for the theatre and directs some of the plays. I mostly remember listening with fascination to John reading the passages from Shakespeare at Lake-wood's Rock and Stock Festival, and playing opposite Maggie Jones here in "Subject Was Roses."

STAN VEITENHEIMER, member of the Executive Committee of TLT, sort of grew up here. He started doing "family" shows at the age of 16 . . . remember . . . "Papa Is All," "Life with Father," "I Remember Mama," and graduated to more sophisticated things, "Daughter of Silence", "Mr. Roberts." Stan says that he is quite a fisherman and claims he caught a 39-lb. salmon out in Commencement Bay. He can also recount similar tales of victories at Westport. Tonight Stan appears as Victor's brother, Walter, who attempts to unravel the tangled web of deception that has strangled the family relationship.

Robert Schmid, teacher, happily retired, enjoying the sweet relaxed rewards of the leisure life . . . playing a little golf, sailing in his boat, watching his three Kerry Blue Terriers, and fishing as the mood and the weather indicates. Says he is a pretty good cook too, specializes in fancy desserts, mentioned something called a Kirschwasser Torte as his favorite. Bob's appearance on stage is a special treat . . . he is a precise and deft actor. Gregory Solomon is a difficult character to portray. Witness now, Bob Schmid, an expert.

Maggie Jones interprets the role of Esther Franz with sensitivity and sympathy. She has a rare talent for projecting mood and feeling with delicate subtlety. A multitude of contributions to Tacoma Little can be attributed to Maggie. She has directed musicals, worked back stage and is at present a member of the Executive Committee. Every Saturday finds her working with the young ones as director of Children's Theatre. Last thing she did here was the wife and mother in "Subject Was Roses."

Does the price we pay for the life we choose have any relationship to its final value? It is a question that Arthur Miller asks and leaves us to answer.
