"WHO'S WHO"

MARY SIMPSON (Gillian), an apt choice to play the role of the Manhatten enchantress. With her past stage performances, she has formed a formidable repertoire in AUNTIE MAME with the Lakewood Players as well as MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT and with our own Tacoma Little Theatre, she has appeared in the role of Honey in WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF for which she won a Dickie Award as the best supporting actress and also appeared in the chorus for last season's musical, HELLO DOLLY. Mary is quite versatile as she has an inherent knack for all facets of backstage activities—in costuming, sets and as a stand-in, etc. Aside from her devoted community oriented activities with our Tacoma Little Theatre, she also gives her valued time to the Tacoma Human Relations Commission.

STAN VEITENHEIMER (Shepherd Henderson) undergoes stages of ambivilent turmoil at the hands of the mystical Gillian of Lower Manhattan's underground, unrecognized ethnic group of warlocks and high priestessess of the occult. Stan brings some 25 years of theatrical experience, touching on the higher echelons of a managerial level (Executive Board President 1972-1973 and Executive Board Member, 1973-1974) through the ranges of theatrical activities including the unsung glories of backstage. Greasepaint is no stranger to Stan either, for it brought him before us in PAPA IS ALL, I REMEMBER MAMA, LIFE WITH FATHER, ABIE'S IRISH ROSE, THREE MEN ON A HORSE, THE BAT, MR. ROBERTS, THE PRICE and DAUGHTER OF SILENCE which earned him a Dickie Award for his supreme performance.

On the other side of the stage lights, Stan is busy as the Manager of the Loan Department of the Pacific First Federal Savings & Loan.

ZOANNE WILKIE (Miss Holroyd), with her mellifluous voice of the Loralei of the Rhine, is convincing as the high priestess of the nether world of magical wierd brews and concoctions. Zoanne inserts into her role, the zest and buoyancy that she does with her everyday activities which includes raising children, wife and outstanding voice teacher. Her past performance such as DAMN YANKEES in 1971, and that of Madam Rose in GYPSY and in TLT's last season's musical, HELLO DOLLY, have been in the musical realm in which she excels. This is Zoanne's initial entrance into the field of drama.

DICK JONES (Nick) lends his histronic flair and is a natural as Gillian's prankish warlock brother. Having graduated from UPS in Speech and Drama has not only given him a well rounded base for his present work with Television Channel 13 but has served him well along with his natural acting talents. He received a Dickie Award for his outstanding performance as the Sergeant in ROMAN CANDLE. Dick's last performance at Tacoma Little Theatre was in SUDS IN YOUR EYE.

PATRICK O'LEARY (Sidney Redlitch) even though raised in Tacoma and attending Bellarmine, he was very active at Carrol College, Helena, Montana where he appeared in SPOON RIVER ANTHOLOGY, UNDER THE MILK WOOD, and ST. JOAN. He gave an enviable performance in THE MAN WHO CAME TO DINNER for Tacoma audiences and his last performance was in THE SOLID GOLD CADILLAC given during the Tacoma Little Theatre's 54th year in February of 1973.


