Another Stadium High School student, Amy Trotter (Susie) also appeared in "Bye Bye Birdie". In addition to dramatics, Amy is active in her school's Madrigal Singers, as well as taking ballet from Jan Collum.

Jeff Cunningham may play the uncoordinated Gus on stage, but in reality is one of Ballet Tacoma's strongest male dancers. Jeff has been in Tacoma for about a year, and this is his first TLT production.

This is **Claudia Groom's** (Terry) third appearance on the TLT stage, where she was last seen in "H.M.S. Pinafore". She is a recent graduate of Stadium and plans to attend Western Washington next year. Her soft spot is theatre.

After graduating from Wilson High School, **Faith O'Neill** (Bunny) studied painting in New York and founded "Youtheater" in Seattle. She and her husband (a Tacoma lawyer) have now settled in Tacoma, and she hopes to become more involved with TLT.

Mary Jo Strom Copland (Jennifer) won her role unexpectedly when, 2 weeks prior to opening night, she was asked to "do a friend a favor". However, her strong theatre and dance background in both California and Tacoma made the task less awesome. Mary Jo works for KTOY FM.

A past music major of TCC, **Hector Cruz** (Flemming) studies voice with Jan Seferian and is currently a member of Ballet Tacoma. He was last seen in "West Side Story" and TCC's "The Fantastics".

This is **Jim Whiting's** (Steve Edwards) first appearance on a Tacoma stage since his 7th grade triumph as "The Littlest Angel", replacing a slow 5-year old who couldn't remember his lines. Apparently there were no hard feelings, since the former 5-year old has cast him in his first TLT role.

In addition to raising four children, **Yvonne Blanch** (Phyllis Owen) works for Ma Bell. It was her second child (Faith) who talked her into her first stage role since high school. In her spare time she skies, sails, gardens, vacations on motorcycles and weekends on jets.

Les Pugnetti (Lee Calhoun) is commuting from Seattle to play his role. Recently accepted at Cornish, Les is employed by a Seattle newspaper, forcing him to give up his backstage contributions at TLT.

Carol Mazer (The Press Agent) doesn't know the meaning of the word "rest". Having worked on sets for "H.M.S. Pinafore" and performing in "No Sex, Please . . .", she divides her time for "Babes" between Stadium's "Bye Bye Birdie" and Ballet Tacoma's "Wizard of Oz".

Another Stadium High student, **Duane Rhodes** (Don) is a newcomer to theater and works part time at Farrells. Not to be outdone, Foss High School has also contributed three members of our cast. **John Kerr** (Peter) not only played the lead in his school's play this year, but also directed a play and appeared with the stage and concert band. **Maria Clavadetscher** (Ann), a Tacoma Youth Symphony member, also takes an above-average interest in music and marine science, which she hopes to study in college. The multi-talented **Mitch Hale** (Bob) divides his time between drama, playing cello in his high school orchestra and dancing with Ballet Tacoma. **Cindi Netzer** (Betty) works for Rainier Bank in Puyallup but hopes to keep an active interest in community theater. TLT's youngest babe, **Kirsten Nevins** (Libby) has already appeared in several productions here, and likes drama almost as much as peppermint candy ice cream.

Tom Birkeland (Director) seems equally at ease in all areas of the theater. Last year's Best Actor winner, Birkeland served as this year's president; and, in addition to direction, wrote one of this show's songs and understudied the role of Lee Calhoun.


