Dick spent 20 years in the United States Air Force as a jet fighter pilot, was a speech and drama major, is married and has two children. He is assisted by JOE MCCARTHY, whose list of credits fills a couple of pages. He is a dancer, choreographer, actor, director, and has worked in theatre in New England, Off-Broadway and other regional theatre groups. LINDA VANRAVENSWAAY, was born in Brady Texas, works for Xerox Corp., likes to sail with her husband and son, is a member of the Board of Directors of TLT, and has contributed her considerable talent and attractiveness to "George Washington Slept Here", "Seven Year Itch", and "6 Rms Riv Vu". A native Tacoman, CHRISTINE FLEMING, has been awarded one Dickie and nominated for another, has a bachelor's degree in Drama, works in mortgage banking, has studied ballet and plays softball for a local team. TOM DAVIDSON, too modest to admit it, is one of the best comedy interpreters in Tacoma. He combines humor with sensitivity to make believable characters.
